noodles, ham and celery salad, whole wheat bread, chocolate bread pudding, milk, tea.

DINNER — Baked spaghetti and beef with tomato sauce, beet and cabbage salad, cranberry and prune pie, milk, coffee.

The same meat does duty for the luncheon soup and dinner main dish. The meat becomes tasteless from the long simmering process of soup making but actually loses little of its nourishment. It should be carefully freed from fat, bone or gristle after cooking for soup and coarsely chopped for use in well seasoned combination dishes such as spaghetti and tomato mixture in the dinner menu.

Rich Muffins
One-half cup butter, 3/4 cup granulated sugar, 2 eggs, 1 2/3 cups milk, 2 cups cornmeal, 1 1/4 cups white flour, 1 teaspoon salt,

6 teaspoons baking powder, 1 cup cleaned currants.

Cream butter and gradually beat in sugar. Sift in 3/4 cup white flour and beat until thoroughly blended. Add eggs well beaten. Add cornmeal. Mix thoroughly and add milk. Mix and sift flour, salt and baking powder and add with currants to mixture. Beat hard for a minute and bake 20 minutes in buttered and floured muffin tins in hot oven.
