PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 27 (AP)—Members of the committee on excise tax and tax equalization today discussed its proposed final report to the general committee appointed by authority of the last legislature. It was expected that this report would be adopted late today.

As read this morning, and before there was time given for a general discussion, the report favored an excise tax. As all members of the sub-committee favor this method of reaching the banks that are protected against the present tax laws of Oregon, it was thought that this plan would be adopted.

water daily from Beaver creek which is about a quarter of a million gallons less than is used. The remainder is furnished by the deep wells, the pumps operating every other night until approximately half a million gallons are forced into the reservoir. During this month about 10,000,000 gallons have been pumped, compared with from 25 to 30 millions during the summer and early fall months. The Beaver creek line is not supplying as much as it is usually capable of, but this is due to lack of water in the hills and not to any fault of the system. Following the dry summer season, the supply of available water has been much lower at the intake than in normal years.

One of the forward steps in the upbuilding of the water system, the city manager explains, is the replacing of old wooden pipes with cast iron mains. At present there are 24 miles of mains in La Grande and only 25 per cent of these are made of wood. The work of replacement is being continued each year. Of 5,000 feet of main to be laid during the next few months, about half of this will be to replace wooden mains, which will decrease the present percentage materially.

In addition to the replacement, the new main will include a six-inch pipe on K avenue from Fourth street to the normal school grounds. Material for this project is being secured now and the work will be started as quickly as possible.

PHOENIX, Ariz., Nov. 27 (AP)—The sensation of a fist fight in legislative halls between the governor of Arizona and State Senator Fred Colter, today re-echoed throughout the state.

Governor Hunt, who unobtrusively walked down the capitol steps in the midst of the chaos, insisted the blow he received was "inadvertently" brought about when Senator Colter moved his arms in argument. His secretary maintained that the staggering blow was intentional.

specimens. Last year the price was 40 and 45 cents.

In 1927 the local dealers had a difficult time getting enough turkeys to sell, but this year their troubles are ended.

The price the local packing house is receiving for the birds is 25 cents.

Turkeys are very difficult to raise. They usually start to hatch

in April or May and it takes from seven to nine months for them to reach maturity.

They grow until a year old. The average weight of a full sized turkey is about 35 pounds. Some of them reach a weight as high as 40 pounds, however, according to producers.

"Those who know the United States," he declared, "know also that we have only one desire and that is to co-operate to a constantly improving understanding; to common progress and to common attainment."

La Union Is But 10 Miles Across the Gulf of Fonseca from Amapala in Honduras. Mr. Hoover made the trip in a motor launch, and found the town enjoying a holiday while waiting for his coming.

"We perhaps hear more of economic and trade relations between countries than any other one subject in the field of international life," he told a "large" audience. "This may be easily explained for out of our economic life do we build up the foundations upon which other progress rests. And our international economic relations can have but an real foundation. They can grow only out of the prosperity of each of us. They cannot flourish in the poverty or degeneration of any of us. Our economic progress is mutual. It is not competitive."

Mutual Problems
"But economic development does not and should not be the sole basis of exchange between nations but rather the incident of it. We have the mutual problems of strengthening the foundation of peace, building up confidence and friendship and the institutions and ideals of each of our nations."

Mr. Hoover was to have returned to the Maryland after he was the guest of honor at a formal dinner in La Union but rough water on the stretch between the shore and the battleship delayed his departure from Salvador.

When the heavy sea subsided naval officers accompanying the

Hoover party decided it was safe for the president-elect to make the trip by launch across the Gulf of Fonseca to the warship.

Guests at Dinner
While the Hoover party was waiting for the blow to subside they were guests of the officials at Salvador at a reception and dinner in the office of the International Railway of Central America.
