AT THE THEATERS

Dramatic Stock Company Here On Wednesday

A season of dramatic stock productions, starting Wednesday November 28th will be presented at the Arcade theater every Wednesday. The first offering of the Dramatic Stock Company will be "White Wrecks," a thrilling tale of the South Seas—differing from other plays of the tropics. "White Wrecks" is a story of mother love, unlike "Kongo" and "Bird of Paradise," which are more or less lustful, this is a drama of a broken home, dealing as it does, with the life of a woman who, in her early life, left home and family—gave on all for a blind, foolish infatuation—married to a man whom she did not love and whom she married out of pity because of a lover's quarrel. After her marriage the sweetheart of her college days returns—she leaves with him and sails for the South Seas where he has become a trader and a power in the affairs of the islands. The play opens in a locality a few miles up the river above Suva, the capital city—22 years have passed—the woman, now a devilish has acquired the dope habit, in her efforts to forget—the man is brutal, having lost all sense of decency, cruel to the extreme, has sunk even lower. Into this morbid atmosphere comes a young missionary—the son of the woman grown to manhood in the belief that his mother died when he was still a baby. The father, still living and a teacher in a local university, has raised the boy to regard his mother as having been a wonderful woman—beautiful and good, taught him to let the memory of the good mother guide him in all things—this he has done and so when he meets Maria he tries to help her redeem herself—not knowing she is his own mother. There is also a sweet love story between the boy and a half-breed native girl. There are many dramatic moments in this powerful story, as well as thrilling situations, brought about through the efforts of Frank, the man in the case, to drive the missionary from the islands and the mother attempts to conceal her identity from her son. The stage settings are tropical and of proper atmosphere. There is a large cast of players some of whom have appeared in this play before.

"The Ladder," a lesson play, has closed up shop in New York with losses of \$1,500,000. It certainly did prove to be a lesson for somebody.

"Devil's Skipper" Showing At Star Theater

Another adaptation of a Jack London story "The Devil's Skipper" a Tiffany-Stahl production opening for a two day's run at the Star theater today and brings to the screen one of the most gripping and vital sea dramas that has been seen in this city for some time. It is one of those masterful dramas that brings to the surface a slice of life that remains hidden until a realistic writer, uncovers it by the written word. Standing out in bold, dramatic relief is the remarkable portrayal of the greatest dramatic actress of the screen, Belle Bennett, who as the devil's skipper gives an insight to this lady's histrionic abilities that rarely leaves one breathless. There is no doubt that in this role Miss Bennett has far surpassed her other historical characters and will live as one of the finest impersonations of its kind ever attempted by any screen star.

The story tells in broad, virile, dramatic strokes of the life of a woman who has become the master of a slave ship just prior to the Civil War. From a gently nurtured and cultured belle of the gay city of New Orleans, she is shanghaied through the machinations of her husband aboard a hell-ship, with her baby left to the flames. Saved from a fate worse than death by a gallant sailor, she finally becomes the master of a slave trader and becomes known as the "Devil's Skipper." For years nurturing a plan of revenge on the husband who so foully abandoned her, she confronts him and plans a terrible revenge. The denouement of this play is one of the most dramatic ever portrayed on the screen. Montagu Love is again seen in a human role while the others including Cullen Landis, Mary McAllister, Gino Corrado, Pat Hartigan, G. Raymond Nye and Adolph Miller add materially to the success of the production.
