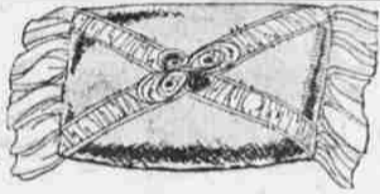

TROJANS TANGLE WITH NOTRE DAME

Fans Awaiting Saturday Intersectional Contest in Los Angeles

SIDLER (Associated Press Sports Writer) LOS ANGELES, (AP)--Southern California and Notre Dame, who have met twice with one point difference in scoring each time, will clash again here December 1. This third meeting promises to be the most exciting of the rivalry. Season records are forgotten when the Trojan-Huskie game rolls around on the gridiron calendar. The coach of each institution knows that he can expect a terrific battle from the rival crew, no matter what their past accomplishments are. The games are struggles of two great representative squads, and pit, in football wit, two of the country's outstanding coaches. Coach Howard Jones of Southern California this year expects the game again to be an evenly matched affair that the contest may be decided by a punt kick, or the lack of one, as were the previous clashes. In 1925, with hard-rocked Morten Kaer doing most of the ball-punting, Southern California lost the sectional title to Notre Dame at the Rockwood. The Trojans boasted another All-America player in 1927, Morley Drury, but a 7 to 6 defeat was marked against the westerners.

When, in the two previous struggles, Notre Dame fitted punners in Southern California, this year it will be a combination of brown and golden jerseys that will confront the Trojans here.

The Trojans will pin their hopes of victory upon the heavy all-around ability of Don Williams, quarterback, who, although consistently lighter than either Kaer or Drury--weighing but 155 pounds--likewise is holding for All-America recognition. Labeled by grid experts as "brave" both defensively and offensively, Jones' ace in the hole possesses almost uncanny judgment in cutting plays and in team generalship, deadly ball-punting ability, and an accurate passing arm.

Should Southern California's power play, in which Williams' punts are backed by a four-man interference wall, Jones would fall back upon what many call the greatest punting threat in the west. The Trojan coach has three men equally brilliant in aerial gun-fire, Russ Saunders, Lloyd Thomas and Williams.

Counting the Hoosier squad, the Notre Dame quintet, Knute Rockne lacks no outstanding punners with whom to cope with the double-weighted Trojan machine. Freddie Collins, full-backing triple-threat man in every sense, handles his weight speedily and is just as dangerous at tackle as he is in plowing through the middle of the line. John Nesbitt, halfback, possesses one of the most accurate punning arms in the business, is like a lightning bolt around the ends. Captain Fred Miller, left tackle, is a great ball-back as well as an aggressive fighter at all times.

BAKER, Ore. The game commences at 2 p. m.

Pendleton should defeat Baker if dope means anything. The Bucks have lost only one game in the fall--to the 12 to 9. They defeated Milton-Freeswater 12 to 7 and tied La Grande, 6 to 6. They are considerably heavier than Baker and on comparative scores they look better.

Coach Glendonman has shifted his line-up somewhat and has the local boys on edge for the last game in the hope of victory which would give the most successful grid season in years a happy ending. Baker will be able to present a much stronger lineup, thanks to the return of men who were out on account of injuries. Brockert and Woodard will be back in the line and Marion Grant will start. Chaffin will play in the backfield for the first time. Bob Howard will start at left end. One guard and one tackle position is still undecided. Baker has had no more since Armistice day.
