**Creamed Veal and Oysters on Toast**  
One and one-half cups diced cold veal, 1 cup solid oysters, 2 tablespoons butter, 1 tablespoon flour, 1 cup milk, 4 triangles toast, parsley, 1 tablespoon lemon juice, salt and paprika.  
Put butter into a sauce pan, add fire for ten minutes. Add veal

and cook until oysters are plump. Sift over flour and stir with a fork until mixture thickens. Bring to the boiling point but do not let boil. Serve on hot triangles of toast arranged on a hot platter and garnish with sprigs of parsley.  
The amount of salt required depends largely upon the original seasoning of the veal.
