Says Fraternities Hurt Football

MONTCLAIR, N. J., Dec. 10 (AP)—Major Stevens, Yale's football coach, thinks that the increase in fraternity activities was an important factor in the hills' unimproved gridiron season.

Speaking at the annual Yale banquet in New Haven, Stevens said he wanted to see no alliance but he did feel that the fraternity questions were one of the most serious handicaps to the football squad.

"Fraternity activities cut heavily into our work during three weeks of the season which were devoted to frat rushing. He said, 'For years members of the faculty have been complaining of the encroachment of fraternity activities on college work but it seems to have taken a demonstration of their harmful effects on football to arouse Yale to a realization that they must be curtailed. Next season, I am assured, they will be so that in one less worry on our shoulders.'"

Georgia Tech and Tennessee Undeclared New Year's Game Left

NEW YORK, Dec. 10 (AP)—Except for a few echoing post-season shouts in the far west, the college football for 1928 is settled.

The experts, as soon as they have finished dodging the all-American football, turn their attention from now on, among other things, to baseball palaces as well as such burning questions as whether Dempsey will stage a come-back, Nural turn pro or Tilden be re-elected. Off hand the answer to all three of these issues will be the affirmative but for the moment they have nothing to do with summing up the gridiron year.

Georgia Tech Leads

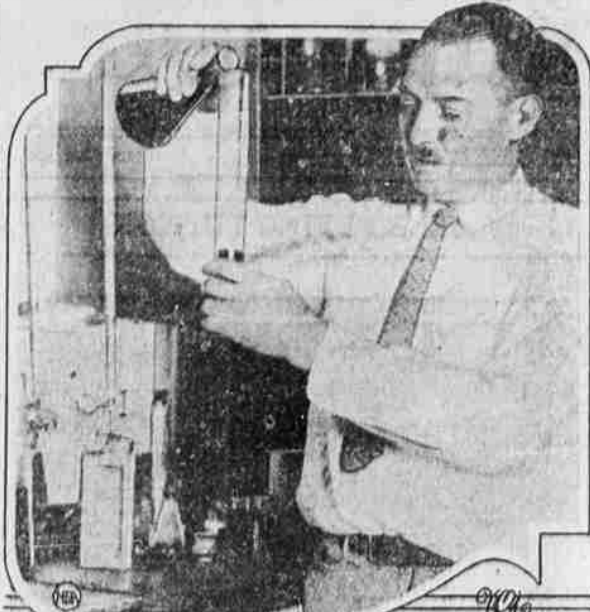
The south has had the last few words in the football debate, so far as the regular season is concerned, but also will have a full share of interest in the main post-season argument as well. Georgia Tech is going to Pasadena New Year's day to play California and attempt to succeed where no outfit east of the Mississippi has done thus far this year against far western opposition.

The tornado of Tech figures to do better than any entry from this side of the country for it goes west with as fine a record of achievement as any team has shown this season. There are only a half dozen major teams with unbeaten records and Tech's powerful array has a strong claim to the top of this list. There's how this select half dozen finished:

Tennessee's talented young band finished its second successive season with only a tie to mar the victorious sweep of the volunteers. Over a three-year stretch Tennessee has only one defeat on its record in 28 games. Twenty-four triumphs, two ties and one setback testify to the results obtained under the West Point system of Major Bob Neyland.

Florida, even though upset by this Tennessee team in the final game at Knoxville Saturday, enjoys the distinction of scoring the highest total of points of any major team in the country. The Gators, dropping their final game by a single point after winning eight in a row, ran up 336 points.

Football Men Are Barred From Game

CHICAGO, Dec. 10 (AP)—Alan Holman, Ohio State's star quarterback, as well as Mayes McLain, Iowa's Cherokee Indian fullback, are apparently through with the Big Ten football.

While McLain was the only one to be officially declared ineligible for further competition by the faculty committee because of the three-year player rule, it was regarded as a foregone conclusion by the committee and coaches that Holman, too, would be banished.

The three-year rule, reaffirmed by the committee during the annual Big Ten sports convocation here Saturday, limits any one to three years of college athletic competition. Holman played a season on the Parsons college football team, another with Iowa State and one at Ohio State. McLain played two seasons with the Haskell Indians and one with Iowa.

McLain was heartily disappointed over his banishment. The big fullback said he planned to finish this year at Iowa and then play either amateur or professional football.

Two Grid Players Win Scholarships

CHICAGO, Dec. 10 (AP)—Two Big Ten football players, Fred Hovde of Minnesota and Robert Hickman of Illinois, again have demonstrated that a student can participate heavily in sports and still keep up his studies.

Hovde and Hickman were the only two students in the Big Ten to be selected to Rhodes scholarships. Hovde, named unanimously as quarterback on the Big Ten all-conference team, was one of the best pilots in Minnesota's history.

TAKE UP LOUGHRAN ISSUE

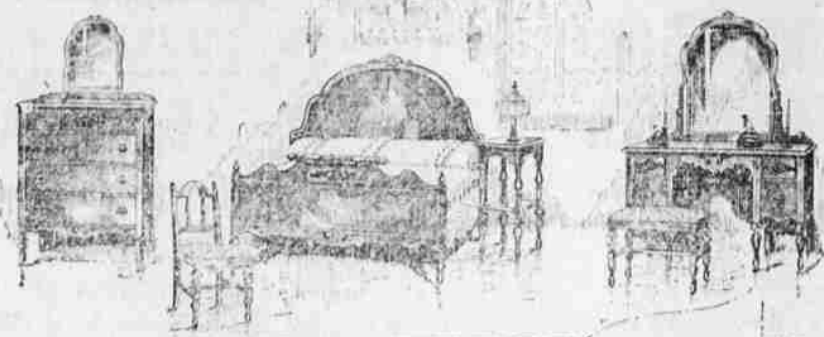

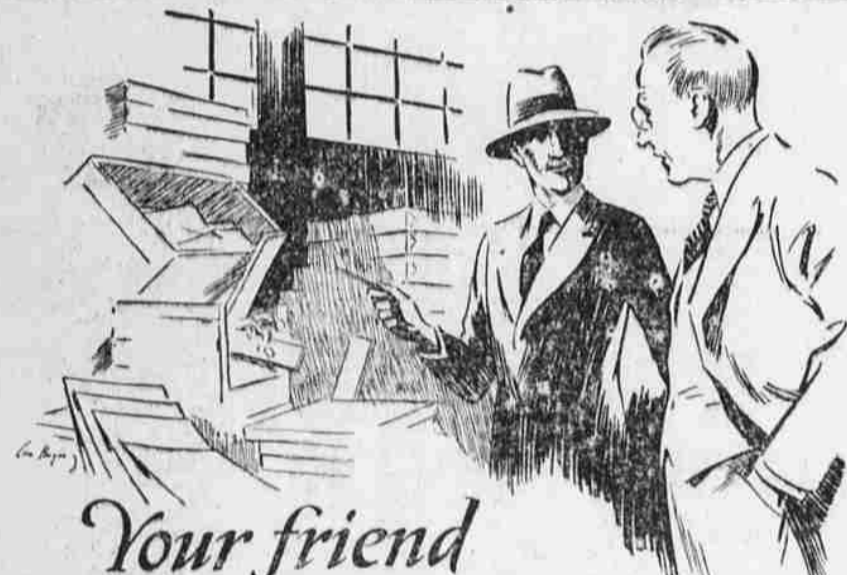
