### CANNED FRUITS AND VEGETABLES

Full of Vitamins, Should Be Eaten Daily, Says Doctor

Dr. Morris Fishbein, Editor of the Journal of the American Medical Association, recently wrote in the New York Telegram about canned fruits and vegetables. If all of the women could read this article, more canning factories would have to be built in a hurry.

He makes this startling statement: "Canned tomatoes, and canned spinach have been tested three years after canning and the evidence did not indicate any appreciable loss in vitamins. Indeed, the canned tomatoes after three years were as rich in vitamins as raw tomatoes. Canned strawberries were also found to retain raw strawberries in vitamin content." He describes how canned cabbage, peas, spinach, apples and peaches were shown to be rich in Vitamin C.

Just think what wonderful news this is for all of us in this country where canning has been developed to such a point of perfection that we can buy canned almost any fruit or vegetable that is grown.

Serve your family liberally with canned fruits for breakfast and for dessert, and serve them liberally with canned vegetables and fruits for luncheon and dinner. Canned peaches, apricots, apples, pears, or strawberries are delicious served with cereals for breakfast and with ice cream for dessert. There is health in delicious canned fruits and vegetables. ### MENUS

**By Sister Mary**  
**BREAKFAST**—Baked apples, cereal, fried dried beef, whole wheat pop-over, milk, coffee.  
**LUNCHEON**—Creamed chicken in baked potatoes, pickled beets and hearts of celery, almond bars, canned cherries, milk, tea.  
**DINNER**—Broiled airloin steak, French fried potatoes, creamed onions, head lettuce with Russian dressing, mixed fruits with custard sauce, milk, coffee.

Chicken left from the roast chicken of the preceding dinner is used for the luncheon dish. If the most notable "stretching" one of two hard-cooked eggs can be added and added.  
Almond bars are delicious with afternoon tea.

**Almond Bars**  
One-third cup butter, 1/2 cup granulated sugar, 2 eggs, 3 table-spoons milk, 1 1/2 cups flour, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1 teaspoon baking powder.

Cream butter and gradually beat in sugar. Beat yolks of eggs with milk and add to first mixture. Mix and sift flour, salt and baking powder and cut into first mixture. Mix thoroughly and roll on a lightly floured molding board into a sheet about one-fourth inch thick. Cut into square or oblong pans and roll and flute edge as for a pie. Fill with whites of eggs beaten until stiff and dry with 1 cup granulated sugar, 1 cup blanched and shredded almonds and 1 teaspoon vanilla. Stir sugar over the top and bake 12 minutes in a moderately hot oven. Let cool, cut in inch strips and remove from pan.
