Seeking the three-cushion championship are: Johnny Layton, Seattle, Wash. champion; Willie Hoppe, New York; Otto Rosen, Philadelphia; and Gus Engstine, Detroit.

Layton won the title last spring by defeating Hoppe. Rosen beats Hoppe and Layton plays Engstine in the opening matches.
