BOLIVIA AND PARAGUAY ON EDGE OF WAR

Paraguay charge d'affaires, Definite acceptance of the offer has not yet been communicated to the conference or the state department but spokesmen for the two countries have indicated that they were agreeable to the move, although Bolivia has been expected to first require reparations from Paraguay as an outgrowth of the attack on Fort Vanguardia.

LA PAZ, Bolivia, Dec. 17—(AP)—The American legation here was the center of a popular manifestation for the United States last night. More than 10,000 persons

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paraded before the building. The direct cause of this was publication of dispatches stating that two former American ministers to Bolivia were making a press campaign in favor of Bolivia and that three American aviators had offered to serve in the Bolivian army.
