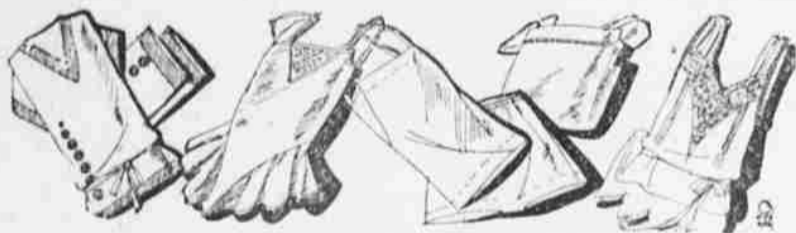

### Billiard Kings Stay On Top In Opening Matches

CHICAGO, Dec. 18. (AP)—Billie Greenberg, of New York, world's pocket billiard champion, and Johnny Layton, of Buffalo, Mo., the slick-haired king of the three-cushion artists, have turned back the first of four attacks to dislodge them from their thrones.

Two champions came through their first matches in the 1928 round robin tournament at Orchestra Hall last night with victories. Greenberg triumphed over Duquaine Stabile, of Baltimore, 125 to 114 in 24 innings, while Layton edged out the veteran Tom Cupples, of Detroit, 39 to 34 in 47 innings of spectacular shot making.

The two men, who are recognized as the greatest threats, came through, however. They were Frank Talschak, of Schenectady, New York, who defeated Edwin Rudolph, of Chicago, 125 to 114 in the pocket billiard match, and the slicker sportswear, Willie Harris, of New York, who beat the former champion Otto Russell, of Philadelphia, 56 to 38. Harris, who is a white, three-cushion title, the only billiard event he has never won, appeared in the match at 10:30.

### SANGOR TRIMMED BY CUBAN YOUTH

Contender for Tod Morgan's Title Knocked Out in the Second Round

By Charles W. Dinkley (Associated Press Sports Writer) CHICAGO, Dec. 18. (AP)—A twenty-year-old Cuban youth, from Armas, fighting with youthful vigor, today became the foremost contender of the world's junior lightweight championship as a result of his surprising two-round knockout over Joey Sangor, of Milwaukee, last night.

Sangor, hitherto regarded as the outstanding contender for the 120-pound title, was smashed to defeat in a spectacular battle that attracted the 15,000 spectators who filled the Coliseum. The freckled face Milwaukee boy had accepted the match merely as a warm-up for his championship encounter with Tod Morgan, of Seattle, the titleholder, in Milwaukee on New Year's day.

Instead of finding Santiago a push-over, Sangor met a two-fisted fighter who traded punches for punches. By his spectacular knockout victory Santiago joined the pugilistic spring that resulted in the elevation of Ray Miller, the conqueror of Jimmy McLarin, James J. Braddock, who vanquished Tuffy Griffith, and R. O. Christian, who polished off Knute Hansen with a knockout.

Santiago finished Sangor like he was an ordinary bean and egg, instead of a contender for a championship. After a blistering first round in which they traded punches like two longshoremen, Sangor came out confidently for the second.

Knocked Silly Within the twinkling of an eye he was groggy and feeling from a sharp right cross to the chin. Santiago nailed him flush on the point of the nose with a short right that knocked him silly. Sangor attempted to reach his opponent, but the Cuban wrenched him off and cracked him with another right. Sangor dropped to the floor for the count of nine.

Alabama-Duncan Bout Attracts Much Attention The semi-final scrap tonight in the Jefferson arena between Kid Alabama, of La Grande, and Mickey Duncan, of Walla Walla, scheduled for six rounds, has been attracting almost as much attention locally as the main event--an eight-round encounter between Dick Roberts, of Pendleton, and Mike Brotherton, of Walla Walla.

Fans who have followed Kid Alabama closely expect him to come back with a more ferocious attack than he has hitherto displayed, particularly due to his loss of a decision two weeks ago to Bud Woodfin. Reports are that the local boy is in good condition and an exciting tilt is anticipated. Duncan comes to La Grande with a good record and Phil H. Williams maintains he considers this will be one of the best bouts on the card.

Besides the two bouts already mentioned, the following four-round scraps are scheduled: Ted Allen, La Grande, vs. Jimmy Kelly, Walla Walla; Wally Scott, Walla Walla, vs. Buck Anderson, La Grande; and Eddie Hall vs. Sandy Anderson, both of La Grande. The card begins at 7:15 o'clock, P. M. Scott will referee.

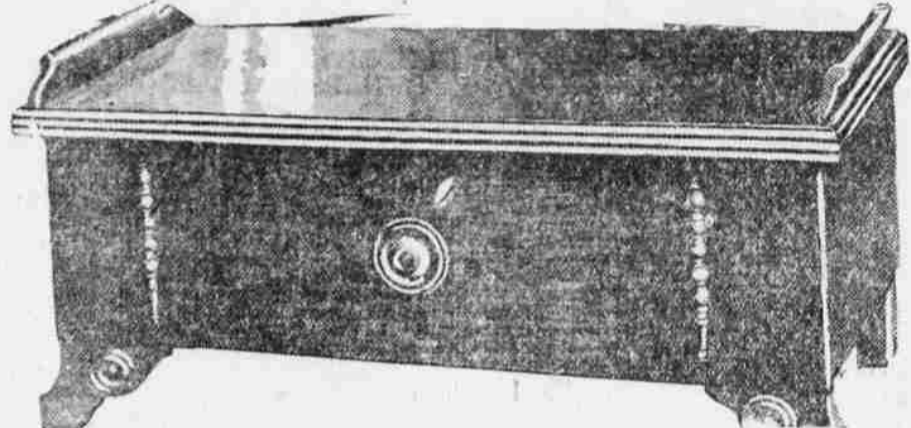
