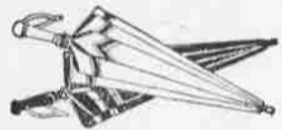

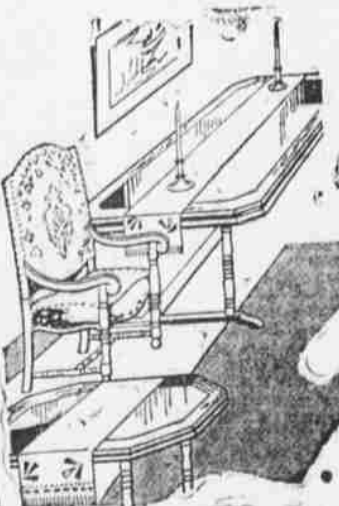

MENUS

By Sister Mary
BREAKFAST—Grape juice with lemon, cereal, cream, scrambled eggs with rice, bran, muffins, milk, coffee.

LUNCHEON—Canned oysters with lemon butter, creamed potatoes, orange salad, toasted muffins, milk, tea.

DINNER—Park tendleton Preenched, scalloped corn, apple fritters, mixed potatoes, cranberry sponge, milk, coffee.

A tablespoonful of lemon juice added to a small glass of grape juice improves the taste for many persons. The lemon juice seems to break the cloying sweetness of grape juice.

Apple Fritters
Two cups thinly sliced apples, 2 eggs, 1/2 cup milk, 2 cups flour, 2 teaspoons baking powder, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 2 tablespoons sugar, 2 tablespoons melted butter.

Beat eggs until very light. Beat in milk, with egg beater. Mix and sift flour, baking powder and sugar. Add to first mixture and stir until smooth. Add melted butter and beat hard. Stir in apples and dry into deep fat. The fat should be 350 degrees Fahrenheit or hot enough to brown an inch cube of bread in 60 seconds. Allow ten minutes for the fritters to cook. Drain on brown paper.
