MENUS

By Sister Mary
BREAKFAST—Baked apples, cereal, cream, crisp bacon, cinnamon toast, milk, coffee.
LUNCHEON—Cream of chicken and rice soup, lettuce sandwiches, canned peaches, children's sponge cake, milk, tea.
DINNER—Cream of lettuce soup, lamb chops, scalloped potatoes, French onion with French dressing, steamed graham pudding, coffee.

When chicken is wanted for a salad or timbales the broth is delicious used the following way: This

soup is nourishing and delicious but too rich for a dinner soup.
Cream of Chicken and Rice Soup
 Four cups chicken broth, 1-2 cup rice, 1 cup heavy cream, 1-2 teaspoon salt, 1-4 teaspoon pepper.
 Wash rice through many waters. Bring broth to the boiling point, add rice and cook in double boiler for two hours. Add salt and pepper. If the broth was not well seasoned when the chicken was cooked more salt and pepper will be needed. Whip cream until firm. Remove broth from heat and stir in cream. Serve very hot. Mince parsley sprinkled over the top of each bowl of "cochon spots" of paprika add to the attractiveness of the service.
