## Beware of Diets to reduce

Medical authorities warn that reducing has gone too far

MEDICAL authorities are becoming alarmed at the extent to which American girls, women and men are reducing their weight by starvation diets. This has gone too far, they say, and in many cases is resulting in permanent injury.

One famous doctor says: "Starving leads to anemia, which may become so persistent that the tissues are no longer able to form blood in the proper way, even when sufficient food is subsequently supplied to them, and a state of actual starvation throughout life may result." This, he goes on to say, "is because any method which defeats nature, long carried out, produces disease changes in the body which frequently become permanent."

Another error is the belief by some that sugar in the diet is the only cause of overweight. This is not true. Any food that is nourishing is fattening and nature should be allowed to store a certain amount of fat in the tissues as a reserve supply of energy when it is needed. Don't undereat; it is dangerous. Eat enough of a great variety of foods and enjoy them. Remember that nothing adds so much enjoyment to other foods as sugar. Sweetness is nature's ideal flavor and modern sugar is food in its least expensive form. Put one cup of sugar in the water used for boiling ham and notice the improvement in appetizing flavor.
