Famous Author Is Dead In England

LONDON, Jan. 8 (AP)—Henry Arthur Jones, author of 79 produced plays, died at his home last night of a lung congestion. He was 77 years old.

Of late years Mr. Jones had been writing of social questions rather than for the theater and in the latest edition of Who's Who he described his recreation as "hunting addition." In 1926-27 he carried on a vigorous newspaper polemic against bolshevism and against the views of H. G. Wells and George Bernard Shaw. Some of these were published in the book "My Dear Wells."
