In the fresh air and sunshine, there is a tonic far superior to anything you can buy in a bottle.

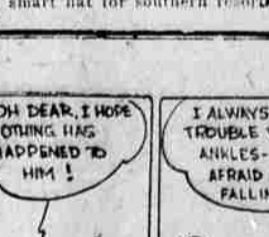
