"The Wind" Now Showing At Arcade

Lillian Gish has furnished the world many surprises; her roles have ranged from the picturesque sweetness of "Hemlock" to the tragic sacrifice of "Mimi"; but it has remained for "The Wind," her newest Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer vehicle playing at the Arcade Theater, to bring out a new side to the actress' many-sided versatility.

A woman at bay—fighting in a primitive wilderness with the savagery of a tigress to save her soul—this is the character she portrays in the mighty drama—perhaps the most remarkable in her entire career.

Star And Director Again Film Success

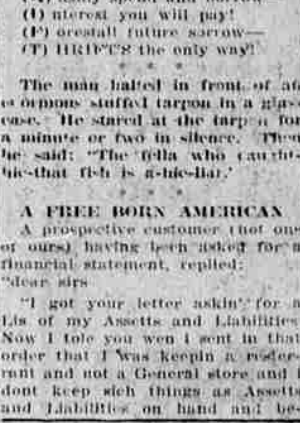

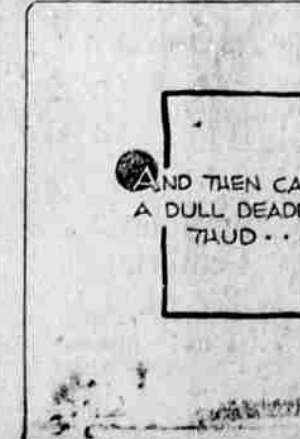
