## MENUS

**By Sister Mary**  
**BREAKFAST**—Orange juice, cereal cooked with dates, cream, bacon omelet, crisp toast, milk, coffee.

**LUNCHEON**—Cream of tomato soup, croquettes, celery and cabbage relish in pepper cups, brown bread and cream cheese sandwiches, pears with vanilla pudding, milk, tea.

**DINNER**—Salisbury steak, mashed potatoes, stewed onions, French endive, open apple pie, milk, coffee.

The luncheon dessert is not ordinary but is very good and can be served to children as well as adults. Desserts of this sort should be served by the lady mother rather than using two varieties, one rich and undesirable for children, planned for grown-up members of the family, and a second simple regular child's dessert. Children need not mean extra cooking nor unpalatable meals if menus are carefully planned.

**Pears With Vanilla Pudding**  
Two cups milk, 1 tablespoon butter, 4 eggs (yolks), 1/2 cup sugar, 1 1/2 tablespoons gelatine, 1 teaspoon vanilla, 4 halves canned pears, raspberry sirup.

Reserve 4 tablespoons milk for gelatine. Put remaining milk with butter in top of double boiler and scald. Beat yolks of eggs with sugar and slowly add hot milk, stirring constantly. Return to heat and cook until mixture coats spoon. Soften gelatine for five minutes in cold water and stir into hot custard. Stir until dissolved and let stand until cool. Add vanilla. Place half a pear in individual molds and fill mold with custard. Let stand until chilled and firm. Turn out of mold and pour over raspberry sirup to serve.

## Influenza Epidemic On Wane in Prison

SALEM, Ore., Jan. 18 (AP)—With but two cases of influenza at the Oregon state penitentiary, the situation has so far improved that the quarantine will be lifted Wednesday, Jan. 23. Supt. Henry Meyers announced this morning. Thirty cases of influenza were recorded during the epidemic at the prison.

Between 25 and 30 patients are said to be suffering with the disease at the state hospital, with approximately 100 cases in the institution since the outbreak of the epidemic.
