**Butter Declines Half a Cent On Portland Mart**  
PORTLAND, Ore., Jan. 18 (AP)—Deductive of larger offerings, butter declined half a cent today. The drop is said to be indicative of a surplus. Cube extras went to 44 and prime firsts to 42 1/2. The egg market stiffened a bit when standard firsts advanced one cent to 24 cents. Other grades remained stationary. Wholesalers dropped lettuce 25 cents all around. Cauliflower showed a slightly weaker value from \$1.25 up. California turnips were selling at 50 cents a dozen bunches wholesale. Other vegetables and fruits remained unchanged.

**WOOL REPORT**  
BOSTON, Jan. 18 (AP)—The Commercial Bulletin tomorrow will say: "The market has been slow and barely firm in price. Stocks of wool in the Boston market, reported at 75 million pounds, at the first of the year, including 53 million domestic, compared with 55 million pounds, including 45 million domestic a year ago, evidently have influenced prices little, dealers having discounted the increase." "London has opened barely firm compared with December rates, Sydney is no more steady, New Zealand and Five Plate markets are firm." "The goods market is slow, with the trade awaiting initial openings of the American Woolen Company Monday." "Mohair is hardly changed with moderate demand." **Wheat Much Higher In Chicago Today**  
CHICAGO, Jan. 18 (AP)—Open-look 1/2 to 1 1/2% higher, corn subsequently held near to the initial range. Wheat started at 1/4 to 1/2% advance and afterward rose a little more. Oats followed other grain. Provisions were easy. Corn closed strong 1 1/2% to 2% net higher, wheat 1 1/2% to 2% net, 1 1/2% to 2 1/2% advance and provisions varying from 5/8 to 7/8 decline to a rise of 10c.
