Farm Pointers

Poultry breeders find it inadvisable to use cockerels and hens from the same setting of eggs in the same pen. The temptation to do this arises when a grower wishes to increase the flock obtained when a setting of high priced eggs have been hatched. The possibilities are that the chicks raised from such a single setting are at least half brothers and half sisters, hence to mate the males with the pullets of the same setting would be virtually inbreeding, which is a dangerous practice unless carefully used, advises the Oregon experiment station.

Preliminary studies of the curly top disease in this state have enabled the Oregon experiment station to list a few varieties or strains of truck crops subject to this disease that are apparently highly resistant. Growers in those sections of the state where curly top or western yellow tomato or bean blight, as it was formerly known, is prevalent, may obtain additional information by writing to the station or to the county agent.

Progressive Oregon farmers are no longer content to make their plans for the future merely on the basis of past results. They are seeking now the latest authentic estimates as to the outlook for the next season in the specific enterprises in which they are interested. To assist in gathering and disseminating this information, the Oregon extension service is sending a representative to Washington, D. C., to aid in compiling the 1929 national outlook report. He will later return and assist with the state and county outlook reports for Oregon.

Many Oregon orchards contain trees of varieties not desired by the owner at this time. These may be top-worked to more desirable varieties by anyone willing to take a little time and care with the work. The ordinary cleft graft is suitable for apples, pears, peaches or plums. Further details of the work may be had from the Oregon experiment station.
