LESS HOGS AND HORSES ON FARM

Increased Consumption Is Expected by President of Crude Rubber Co.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 1.—Decreased numbers of hogs, horses and mules, increased numbers of sheep and about the same number of cattle on January 1, 1929, compared to a year ago, are shown by the annual estimate of livestock numbers on farms issued by the United States department of agriculture.

Horses and mules. Horses continued to decrease in number and are at the lowest point in over forty years.

Cattle. Cattle numbers are practically the same as a year ago. It appears that the decline in numbers which began in 1918 has just been checked.

NEW "BABY BROTHER" OF LINDY'S PLANE PASSES FLIGHT TESTS



New experimental low-wing monoplane developed by the holders of Lindbergh's "Spirit of St. Louis" has demonstrated the practicability of several new design features during its flight tests. The three quarter view (above) shows the plane has neither rudder fin nor stabilizer, while the front view (below) displays the exceptionally wide landing gear track.
