## Across Atlantic With Zeppelin Is Newest Talkie

Only one woman in all the world has ever flown across the Atlantic from Europe to America. That woman is the beautiful and accomplished Lady Drummond Hay, the central figure in the new talking motion picture, "Across the Atlantic via Zeppelin," which will be shown at the Arcade theater Thursday, Friday and Saturday by Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer in association with Hearst newspaper.

Many women have tried to fly the Atlantic. Several lost their lives in the attempt. One woman succeeded in flying from America to Europe. But Lady Drummond Hay is the only one of her sex who has ever made the more difficult trip from east to west. Equally remarkable about the trip across the ocean made by Lady Drummond Hay is the fact that also aboard the Zeppelin was a cameraman, Robert Hartman, who recorded in thrilling motion pictures every detail of the journey.

Lady Drummond Hay returned from China just as the arrangements for the flight of the Great Zeppelin were being completed. She hastened to Friedrichshafen but it was only after long arguments that Dr. Eckener agreed to take her along as one of the two newspaper representatives.

In the talking picture, "Across the Atlantic via Zeppelin," Lady Drummond Hay describes in detail the most thrilling and dramatic voyage aboard the Zeppelin. She tells of the bravery of Knute Ricks, who was the first to step forward when his father, the commander, asked for volunteers among the women to take the perilous trip aloft to repair the tattered fin.

Lady Hay describes most vividly, too, the enthusiasm to which those aboard gave vent as land was first sighted in the gray dawn. In addition to those vivid descriptions one hears, in this remarkable picture, all of the sounds that came to the ears of those aboard the ship during its great flight—the jubilant cries of the workmen as the Zeppelin rose gracefully away from its hangar at Friedrichshafen; the singing of school children as the great silver bird passed over the villages and towns of Germany; the ringing of church bells; the greeting blast of a steamer far below as the Zeppelin sped across the Atlantic; the screaming of hundreds of sirens in New York harbor and the shouts of acclaim from hundreds of thousands of enthusiastic spectators who lined the streets and tops of buildings in New York.

## Income Tax Pointers

No. 3  
Forms for filing returns of individual income have been sent to taxpayers by collectors of internal revenue. Failure to receive a form, however, does not relieve the taxpayer of his obligation to file a return and pay the tax within the period prescribed—on or before March 15, 1929, if the return is filed on a calendar year basis.

Persons whose net income for 1928 was derived chiefly from salary or wages and not in excess of \$5,000 should make their income tax returns on Form 1040-A.

Persons whose net income was derived from a profession or business, including farming, or from the sale of property or rent, although the amount was less than \$5,000, are required to use the larger Form 1040. The use of Form 1040 is required also in the case of a partnership.
