Stocks Dip As Money Rate Is Turned Higher

NEW YORK, Feb. 8 (AP)—Prices chimed about nervously on the New York stock exchange today, as yesterday's sharp break and another increase in brokerage loans, amounting to \$110,000,000, left speculative sentiment completely unsettled.

A pronounced rally developed during the forenoon, with a number of copper, steel, motor and merchandising shares regaining from \$2 to \$10 of the previous day's losses, but a "bear" raid soon after midday precipitated a rush to sell, wiped out most of the gain, and depressed several issues \$2 to \$5 under yesterday's closing prices.

Final liquidation broke out when call money rose to 9 per cent in the final hour. U. S. Steel dipped to 17 1/2, comparing with last month's record of 19 1/2. The gold sold 24 1/2, contrasting with the previous price of 25 1/2.

NEW YORK, Feb. 8 (AP)—The stock exchange and the call market will be closed tomorrow. The reason assigned by exchange officials is that brokers' clerical staffs crippled by influenza, must catch up with their work.

Announcement of the suspension of trading was made at the close of a session marked by a general drop which carried some stocks down 19 points.
