Income Tax Pointers

No. 9

Gross income, as defined by Treasury regulations, "includes in general, compensation for personal and professional services, profits in sales and decline in property, interest, rents, dividends, and gains, and income derived from any source whatever unless exempt from tax by law."

The gross income of the usual business consists of the gross profits on sales, plus any income from investments and incidental or outside operations or sources. The return must show the gross sales, purchases, and cost of goods sold. To reflect net income correctly inventories are necessary at the beginning and end of each taxable year.

A lawyer, doctor, architect, author, dentist, clergyman, or other professional man must include in gross income all fees, salaries, and compensation for professional services.

The farmer is required to report in his gross income all profits derived from the sale or exchange of farm products and livestock, whether produced on the farm or purchased and resold. The fair market value of merchandise or groceries received in exchange for farm products must be included. Also profits from renting a farm on the crop-share basis and the rental and sale of farm lands.

Chaney In Strange Roie At The Star

The strange illusions of a magician of the stage, and the even stranger illusions of voodoo priests and devil worshippers in the jungles of Africa are among the mysteries in Lam Chaney's latest Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer thriller, "West of Zanzibar," which is now being shown at the Star theater.

As "Dead Legs Pitt" Chaney first appears in the picture as a stage magician, performing the same illusions and then, paralyzed in a fight with an enemy, is next seen in the African jungles raving a tribe of savages by his strange "magic" as a "white voodoo" priest. Lionel Barrymore plays the fugitive enemy and Mary Nolan, seen as Chaney's daughter, is a dominant figure in this uncanny structure of terror and revenge. Warner Baxter, Jane Daly and others of note appear in the cast.

Ted Browning, director of "The Unholy Three," "The Road to Mandalay" and other Chaney hits, directed the new production.

Among the sensational highlights are the replicas of weird voodoo rites and the ceremonies of devil worshippers in the Congo jungles, with hundreds of people taking part in the orgies of terror.

Jannings' Film At Arcade Features Suspense

Suspense—like that of a great detective story—marks the unfolding of Emil Jannings' latest star-

ring picture, "The Patriot," which Ernst Lubitsch directed for Paramount.

Plotting against an emperor who boasted that every man in his kingdom was under the direct surveillance of the police is the dangerous and exciting work which falls to the lot of Lewis Stone, who, with Florence Vidor, plays opposite Jannings in this picture.

From the opening shot, plot, counter-plot, intrigue and mystery discover "keep" the audience in sympathetic terror at the Arcade theater Thursday.

Laid in the court of the Czar Paul the First of Russia, "The Patriot" brings a gorgeousness of production as a background for an enthralling story, which has rarely been viewed on a local screen.

Despite the fact that the audience is always conscious of an enormous palace, great numbers of soldiers, poasantry and the plains of Russia, attention is never once detracted from the hand of people used to tell an engrossing and fascinating story. Emil Jannings as Czar Paul deserves to be placed beside that of his "Peter the Great" ("The Last Days of Pompeii") and "The Way of All Flesh," portrayals which already made him one of the greatest pantomimists of all time.

As "The Patriot," Lewis Stone presents a character which is finer than anything he has done since "Saramouche." Florence Vidor as the Countess Osberman moves through the sentences of this picture with convincing realism and a savvy which stamps her as one of the screen's finished artists.

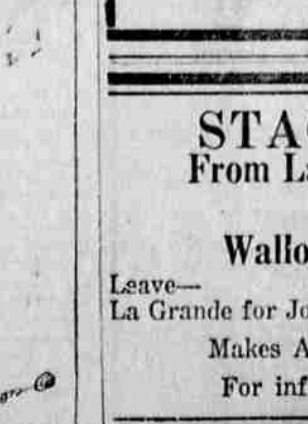

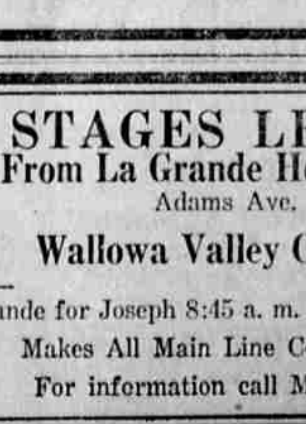
