WIDOW'S SUICIDE FOLLOWS SLAYING

Leaves Note Which Officers Believe May Help Solve Death Mystery

WILLIAMSBURG, Conn., Feb. 14 (AP)—Further interest in the slaying of County Detective William E. Jackson was aroused today by the suicide of Mrs. Gertrude Jackson, his widow.

Before she shot herself she wrote a note. It was turned over to the medical examiner. Police hoped it would aid in solution of the mystery of her husband's death.

Tenor A. Rice, special deputy sheriff and former boarder at the Jackson home, was indicted last week for killing Jackson.

Jackson was shot two weeks ago when seated in the kitchen of his home. Mrs. Jackson took a rifle from the kitchen and used it in an upstairs room yesterday. The note, unsigned and sealed, was discovered after Mrs. Jackson's daughter, Juanita, and others found her body.

Believe It Inside Job Investigating authorities have worked on the assumption that Jackson's killing was an inside job. Hicc, a friend of the family was arrested after he had acted as a pallbearer at Jackson's funeral.

When he was indicted for murder Mrs. Jackson and Juanita, her 24-year-old daughter, both of whom testified before the grand jury were the first to offer their sympathy.

In a friendly manner they shook hands, talked with Hicc for several minutes and then bade him goodbye as he was taken to a cell.

Holds Inquest Yesterday Coroner Arthur G. Hill had an inquest. Among the 12 witnesses were Mrs. Jackson

and her daughter, both of whom were questioned in private. A young girl and neighbor of Hicc, told the coroner that she had seen an automobile drive away from Hicc's home on Sunday morning, two days before Mr. Jackson was slain, and that two women were in the machine. On the same day, it was learned, Rice was ordered from the Jackson home.
