Income Tax Pointers

No. 10

Net income upon which the tax is assessed is gross income less certain specified deductions, such as business expenses, losses, interest paid, bad debts, depreciation, rents, contributions, etc.

Deductions for business expenses form a large item in the returns of many taxpayers and must have certain qualities to be allowed. They must relate to the business, trade, profession, or vocation in which the taxpayer has invested time and money for the purpose of a livelihood or profit.

A taxpayer may conduct more than one business and claim deductions for the business expenses of each.

Farm Pointers

For insect pests that chew their food and devour foliage, stomach poison is used to get control, says the Oregon experiment station.

Contact poisons are used effectively for the insects that suck their food through a beak. Gas fumigation is used against inaccessible insects, stored grain pests and others that cannot readily be reached by other treatments.

A farm manager, says the Oregon experiment station, needs all the knowledge available in order to plan intelligently his crop and livestock program for the future.

Close watching of news items will help him to know what other farmers are planning.

Growers of peas and beans in Oregon can insure themselves of a weevil free crop if they kill all the weevils in the beans and peas they hold over for food or seed, says the experiment station.

The weevils fly from these infested products to the growing plants and lay their eggs on the peas and beans in the field. Fumigation by carbon bisulfide is the best way to kill these pests.

The peach and prune twig-miner is efficiently controlled in Oregon with one thorough, well-timed spray in the dormant season.

Commercial fluid lime sulfur, 32 degrees Baumé test, 1 to 10, applied any time from late February until the early pink stage of blossom buds, has given excellent control of this pest, finds the experiment station.

AT THE THEATERS

"The Patriot" Features Emil Jannings

"The Patriot," which makes its appearance today at the Arcade theater, is Emil Jannings' greatest starring vehicle.

Other members of the cast, Tullio Carminati, Vera Voronina, Harold Cosselin and others, under the masterly direction of Lubitsch, present character studies which are amazingly real.

"West of Zanzibar" Now Playing at Star

"West of Zanzibar," a Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer production, with Lon Chaney as the sinister "White Legs Flint", paralyzed "white voodoo" of a savage African tribe, is the attraction playing at the Star theater.

The new Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer production, a grim drama of primitive emotions in a wild jungle, shows Chaney in one of the most remarkable of his roles, that of a former stage magician who, paralyzed in a fight with the man who stole his wife's love, follows his enemy into the Dark Continent, using his magic to terrorize and rule savages and to wreak a terrible revenge.

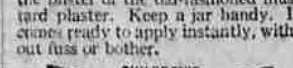
Physicians say she has a chance to recover and yesterday declared her condition was "somewhat improved."
