Income Tax Pointers

No. 11
Typical business expenses of a mercantile establishment which are deductible in a return of income are amounts paid for advertising, hire of clerks and other employees, rent, light, heat, water, telephone, property insurance, and delivery expenses. The expenses of a manufacturing business include labor, raw materials, repairs, light and heat, power, selling cost, administration and other charges.

A professional man, such as a lawyer, doctor, architect, dentist, etc., may deduct the cost of supplies used in his practice, expenses paid in the operation and repair of an automobile used in making professional calls, dues to professional societies, subscriptions to professional journals, office rent, cost of light, fuel, water, and telephone used in his office, and the hire of office assistants.

The farmer may deduct all amounts paid in the production, harvesting, and marketing of crops, including labor, cost of seed and fertilizer used, cost of minor repairs to farm buildings (other than his dwelling), and small tools used up in the course of a year or two.

The best time to dehorn a calf is when he is from 4 to 10 days old. Apply vasoline around, but not on, the horn buttons and then rub caustic soda or caustic potash on the horns, making a spot about the size of a nickel. Discontinue rubbing before bleeding starts.

When beef cattle are to be finished on grass with supplementary feeds it is better to rough them through the winter on a ration of silage, straw and cottonseed or linseed meal, or on a hay and straw or stover ration with some protein meal in the absence of legume hay, and to save the grain for summer feeding on grass.

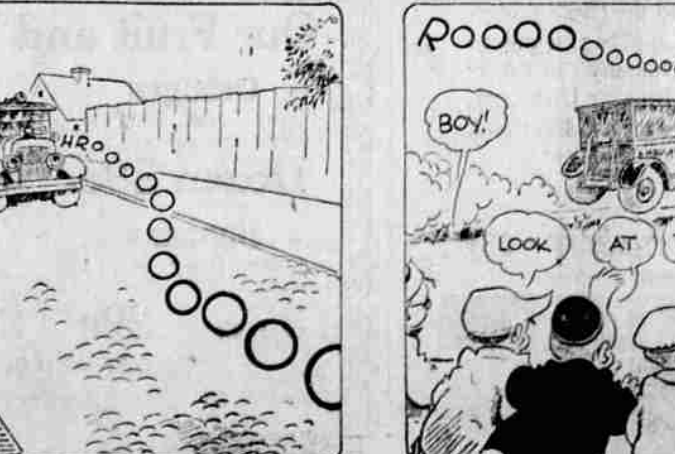
