OFFICE GIRL HELPS GUARD FIGHT CONVICT

SALEM, Ore., Feb. 20 (AP)—Presence of mind of a 20-year-old girl in a doctor's office and quick action upon the part of a veteran guard of the penitentiary, prevented the escape of Walter Fisher, 26, convict, while he was receiving medical attention in an oculist's office here Tuesday afternoon.

Fisher was brought to the office by W. E. Lamb, guard, for treatment of a cataract. Dr. C. H. O'Neill requested Lamb to remove the prisoner's handcuffs while an examination was made. When Lamb attempted to replace the cuffs in the next room, Fisher attempted to grab his gun and savagely bit Lamb's arm. Miss Claire Cornell, the office girl, came to Lamb's assistance, blocking the prisoner's attempt to obtain a gun with one hand and grabbing Fisher's hair with the other hand, her calls for help bringing Dr. O'Neill, who helped subdue the convict. Lamb was forced to receive medical attention for his injured arm.

DEATH WINDS UP LIFE TERM IN STATE PEN

DEER LODGE, Mont., Feb. 20 (AP)—Younger hands will sound the dinner bell at Montana's state prison today, "Old Mike" Foley is dead. Just a month less than 59 years ago, Old Mike entered the prison under a life sentence for the murder of Wellington Frederick, near Pony, Mont. Death has ended the sentence which three officers of a parole did not end.

Old Mike began his sentence in the territorial penitentiary, Montana was not then a state. For years Old Mike had been a trusty. The ringing of the dinner bell had been his old "job." Old Mike could leave the prison whenever he wished and he was given the freedom of the place inside the walls. Often the old man could be seen walking down the streets of Deer Lodge in his prison garb—but always he returned in time to ring the dinner gong. General Grant had commended Old Mike before he entered the prison for bravery he had shown in Indian battles. Old Mike's grave is in view of the prison turret, and the life sentence which a long dead judge meted out, has been ended.
