He planned the fight next Wednesday night as a gigantic advertising proposition not only for his investments here but for the corporation as well. Tex once said he was willing to take a loss of \$100,000 and consider it well spent.

Other Cities Envious

And now from an entirely unexpected source comes the promise that the Garden corporation unwittingly has stumbled onto a new by-product of boxing, a discovery that may prove one of the most prosperous in the history of the sport instead of a financial failure.

So great has been the advertising that has come to Miami Beach through the battle itself, the influx of newspapermen and prominent visitors that other cities in the south are casting envious eyes on the publicity that has boomed this city even beyond the exciting days of 1925 and 1926. Already Bill Carey has received propositions from cities in California and other parts of Florida, but Tampa on the west coast seemed to have outdistanced all the rest.

Carey was amazed at an unexpected offer of \$100,000 from the rival resort to stage another heavyweight engagement next winter beside the waters of Tampa Bay. The money was offered the Garden corporation, he said, merely for the stadium at a match in that city without thought of a share in the profits. Although Miami Beach paid nothing for the privilege of staging the Sharkey-Stribling match, indications are that the property resulting will bring the society resort into the bidding for any return engagements that the Garden may play in the south.
