SLOW ON REGENT CONSOLIDATION

The legislature has taken hold of the scheme to consolidate the regents of the university, state college and normal schools into one body to govern higher education in Oregon.

Many advantages appear on the surface of the plan. With only one board of regents, much of the present controversy between boards would be eliminated.

But the change is revolutionary in Oregon. It would be far-reaching in influence, and would or could affect the lives and prosperity of practically everyone in the state.

What states have a consolidated board of regents governing all state schools? What is the plan of organization in those states? What has been their experience?

These and dozens of other questions relating to a scheme for one board of regents should be answered in great detail before any definite action is taken.

A plan that is right in its general aspects can be extremely damaging to the state's best interests by inadequate and poorly conceived details.

The idea of consolidation is not new. Other states have tried it, some to their benefit and some to their great sorrow.

What the fate of the bill will be in the house, we cannot predict at this time but the governor will be entirely justified in a veto if it is passed without more exhaustive investigation and study than the plan has had so far.

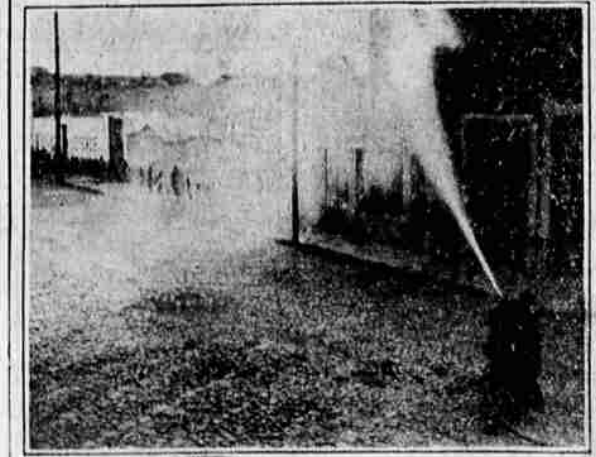
