LOS ANGELES WINS DEPOT FIGHT

WASHINGTON, Feb. 25 (AP)—The city of Los Angeles today won its appeal to the District of Columbia court of appeals to compel the Interstate Commerce Commission to order the Southern Pacific, the Atchafalaya, Toncha and Santa Fe and Los Angeles and Salt Lake railroad companies to erect and maintain a union station in that city at a point known as the Plaza. The cost of the proposed station has been estimated at \$10,000,000.
