Root Vegetable Supply Heavier; Lettuce Firmer

PORTLAND, Ore., Feb. 26 (AP)—No changes were reported in egg and butter prices today.

Root vegetables, following the scarcity incident to the recent snow have begun to come in in larger quantities with a resultant easing off in values. Beets, carrots, parsnips and turnips may be had at moderate prices.

Onions were reported a bit under despite recent widespread talk about their dwindling proportions, but the cheaper price is not due to any increase in supply, but to a marked decrease in demand. If consumers continue to snub the onion, the present supply is likely to last till the new crop begins to arrive.

Lettuce was firmer because eastern markets were taking all the coast surplus. Cabbage was more plentiful and also cheaper. It is priced 4 cents a pound, wholesale.

The orange situation is readjusting itself. The smaller oranges, which have been sweeping the market at low prices, are decreasing, and the larger sizes are increasing in supplies, with the prediction made that the smaller sizes will advance in price while the larger ones will decline somewhat.

Country killed meats and poultry were steady with supplies light.

CHICAGO, Feb. 26 (AP)—Opening 1/2 to 3/4 off, Chicago wheat afterward underwent some further setback. Corn and oats were relatively firm, with corn starting unchanged to 3/4c up and later holding near to the initial figures. Provisions inclined downward.

Corn closed firm 1/2 to 3/4c not higher, wheat 1/2 to 3/4c up, oats 1/2 to 3/4c advance, and provisions varying from 2c decline to a rise of 1/2c.
