PORTLAND, Ore., Feb. 28 (AP)—Top grade eggs dropped half a cent to 26 cents today. Other egg grades and butter were unchanged. Hothouse radishes from Walla Walla and green onions from Medford are on the market. The radishes were quoted at 90 cents a dozen bunches and the onions at 60 cents a dozen bunches, wholesale.

Cauliflower was a bit higher and potatoes were inclined to ease off in price. Poultry and other country meats were steady and unchanged.

Rally Halted But Closing Is Strong

NEW YORK, Feb. 28 (AP)—Ten per cent call money, making its second appearance on the New York stock exchange this month, checked a promising rally in prices today. Thirty issues were marked up to new high records, a few high priced specialties soaring 5 to 50 points, and a long list of popular industrials selling 1 to 4 points above last night's closing quotations before the selling movement started around mid-day.

The closing tone was strong, S&P 500 approximated 4,000,000 shares.
