## Income Tax Pointers

No. 27  
To obtain a deduction for traveling expenses, which form an important item in the returns of many taxpayers, certain regulations must be observed. The taxpayer is required to attach to his return a statement showing the nature of business in which engaged, number of days away from home during taxable year on account of business, total amount of expenses incidental to meals and lodging while absent from home on business, and total amount of "other expenses incidental to travel and claimed as a deduction." Among the "other expenses" are tips, which are held to be a part of traveling expenses, provided they are reasonable in amount. Traveling expenses are deductible only when the trip is on business. They are limited to such expenses as are reasonable and necessary in the conduct of the business and directly attributable to it. Examples are payment for the use of a sample room or the hire of vehicles, in visiting customers.

## AT THE THEATERS

### "Moran of The Marines" Now Showing at Star

Rapid-fire action describes "Moran of the Marines," starring Richard Dix, which opens today at the Star theater. The story is swift moving from beginning to end packed with thrills, tense moments and laughter.

Dix is at his best in the happy-go-lucky role he portrays in this picture. While he has his serious moments, his ability to handle the laughs makes "Moran" one of his finest to date.

Ruth Elder, the pretty aviatrix who drew so much attention with her almost successful flight across the Atlantic, makes her professional motion picture debut in this picture. She performs in a veteran manner, and impresses one as being a natural screen "find."

This plays an irresponsible youngster who excites his rich uncle's ire by getting into jail. He wants to go to China because the girl he has "fallen" for is going there, so he selects the United States Marine Corps to send him there. What he hasn't found out, however, is that the young lady is the daughter of the marine general.

The picture is one of quick action in which members of the supporting cast rise to the occasion. Rosemary Karns gives an admirable characterization of Dix's buddy, and Duke Martin portrays a hard-boiled sergeant in a typical manner. Brooks Benedict does excellent "menacing" as the villain and Capt. E. H. Calvert is perfect as the marine general.

The story was written for the screen by Linton Wells, famed war correspondent. Frank Steyer, who directed the production, lives up to his previous hits, and injects plenty of breezy action into the play.

### Sidney, Hersholt Co-Starred In Film at Arcade

The Arcade theater schedules a Universal comedy drama, "Give and Take," co-starring George Sidney and Jenn Hersholt, as its major entertainment beginning Thursday. This screen production is adapted from the popular Aaron Hoffman stage play and is to be a human as well as a humorous picture. George Lewis and Sharon Lynn supply the romantic element, in important supporting roles.

"Give and Take" concerns an old fruit canning factory owner, played by Hersholt, and his superintendent, played by Sidney. Lewis plays the owner's son and heir, and Miss Lynn the daughter of the superintendent. That young lady also has the dual role of secretary to the boss and fiancée to the boss' son. It is when the son comes home from college and tries to re-organize his father's business on a profit-sharing basis that the fun starts. The addition of a hard-boiled banker who holds a mortgage on the factory, and a crazy millionaire with a wild chain store scheme, rolls the plot merrily along but almost wrecks the romance.

George Sidney is said to have the funniest role of his career in this screen comedy. Jenn Hersholt also is provided with a role of great character possibilities. The two screen veterans make an excellent comedy team. George Lewis, of "College" fame, and Miss Lynn are seen in pleasing characterizations.

William Beaudine directed the picture from a Harvey Threlkeld adaptation. Others in the cast are Sam Hardy, Rhoda M. Cross and Charles Hill Malles.

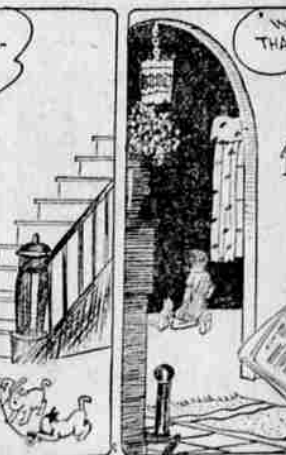
