Youthful Musher Is First In The Pas Dog Classic

THE PAS, Mar. 7 (AP)—Elli St. Godard, youthful musher, was recovering today from a battle through a blizzard to win The Pas dog derby.

St. Godard stumped across the finish line at 11:09 p. m. and night, completing the 200-mile non-stop mush to Ft. Flavel and return in 24 hours and 59 minutes.

Earl Hydriges was second, three minutes behind St. Godard. Gabriel Campbell was third, finishing at 11:34. His brother Hector finished fourth, half a minute behind him.

Wins Regularly.—St. Godard has won The Pas dog derby each year since 1925 but this was his first victory over the 200-mile course. His team was six northern huskies. When he finished he carried one of the dogs on the sled.

Previous to this race, the last non-stop 200-mile mush was run in 1924 when "Shorty" Russell finished with his team of Russian wolf hounds in 23 hours and 52 minutes. St. Godard's slow time was attributed to the terrific blizzard that hit the trail on the 31st which the mushers were obliged to pump their sleds.

After the Campbell Brothers crossed the line, three teams remained on the trail. All were expected to finish.

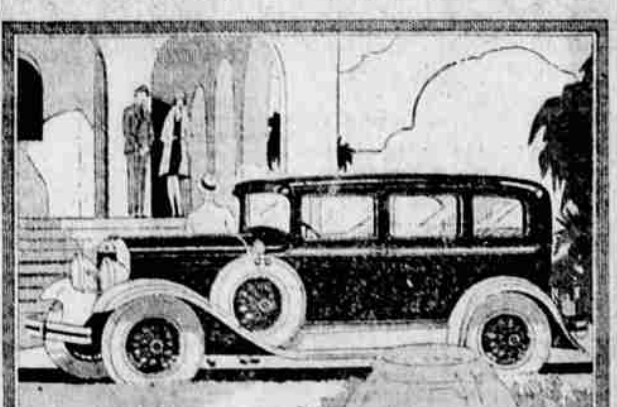
the suggestion made by a member of the team that Bolton might be on his way to camp by way of California.
