

### Egg And Butter Quotations Not Disturbed Today

PORTLAND, Ore., Mar. 8 (AP)—Egg and butter prices were not disturbed at the Thursday afternoon session of the dairy exchanges. Supplies of both are sufficient to fill all needs. Values are likely to remain unchanged until buyers increase their orders or sellers become more eager.

The tomato situation seems to be getting more acute with the embargo established on the Mexican line. Prices considerably higher than those prevailing were expected any time.

The onion trade continues weak with buyers holding off.

Tangerines and jumble oranges are being offered at low prices. The tangerines bring 2.25 for half an orange box and the jumble sell for \$2 for a box of 250.

Asparagus is selling at 45 cents a pound and fresh Hawaiian pineapple at \$6 a crate.

### Fight For Reduced Refrigeration Won

SALEM, Mar. 8 (AP)—A fight for reduced refrigeration costs on carload shipments of dairy products from Oregon points to eastern destinations and to other Pacific Coast states has been won by the Pacific states butter, egg, cheese and poultry associations. The Interstate Commerce Commission has handed down a decision in favor of the applicants, according to information received by the Oregon Public Service Commission which was a party in support of the associations. The I. C. C. order requires that the carriers establish the reduced basis of cost on or before May 1 of this year.

"The new refrigeration cost will be determined by the cost of ice and salt used rather than on a stated amount as in the past," says a statement by the Oregon commission. "and will result in material reductions, the amount depending upon the actual cost of ice and salt necessary for standard refrigeration."

### Wide Swings In Stock Prices In Closing Period

NEW YORK, March 8 (AP)—Speculation for the advance was ruminated on a broad scale in today's stock market after an early period of weakness. Early losses of 1 to 3 1/2 points were quickly wiped out, and the general market turned upward under the leadership of Radio (old stock), which rallied from a low of 39 1/2, off 3 1/2 points, to a new high record at 43 1/2. Radio (new) also changed hands in enormous volume at rising prices.

Wide price swings continued in the radio group in the final hour. Radio (old) reaching 44, while the new stock crossed 38. Western Union lost nearly all of its six point advance. Reduction in the call money rate to nine per cent influenced more general buying, with food issues, particularly post- and National Biscuit moving up fast. The closing was strong. Sales approximated 2,369,000.
