SMALL PERMITS ISSUED IN WEEK

New Construction in La Grande in Last Two and Half Months \$6,360

Four building permits were issued last week by City Recorder J. E. Stearns, all in small amounts however. One was to Del Hudson to alter and repair the Foley hotel building on Adams between Chestnut and Depot.

The permits follow:

Mar. 4—Del Hudson, to alter and repair Foley hotel building on Adams between Chestnut and Depot, C. D. Goodenough, contractor, estimated cost of work \$150.

Mar. 6—William Rollins, to alter and repair a one-story home on Main avenue between Washington and Spring for C. H. Griffin, work to cost \$250.

Mar. 7—H. H. Huz, to alter and repair a dwelling on Fourth between Washington and Adams, work to cost \$250.

Mar. 11—Jack Pitts, to erect a building on N between Ninth and Washington, to cost \$40.

Total is Small

Permits issued last week brought the year's total to date to \$6,360. The figure for February was \$5,500.

Building permits of other Oregon cities for February included: Albany \$8,500, Astoria \$390, Eugene \$78,876, Klamath Falls \$42,925, Marshfield \$15,250, Medford \$65,825, Portland \$1,045,075 and Salem \$56,892.

Adding La Grande this made a total of \$1234,032 for February, compared with \$1,830,075 for February, 1928.

Mr. and Mrs. Frank Leonard, of Roosevelt, Wash., have been visiting with their daughters, Miss Donna and Jane Scott this week.

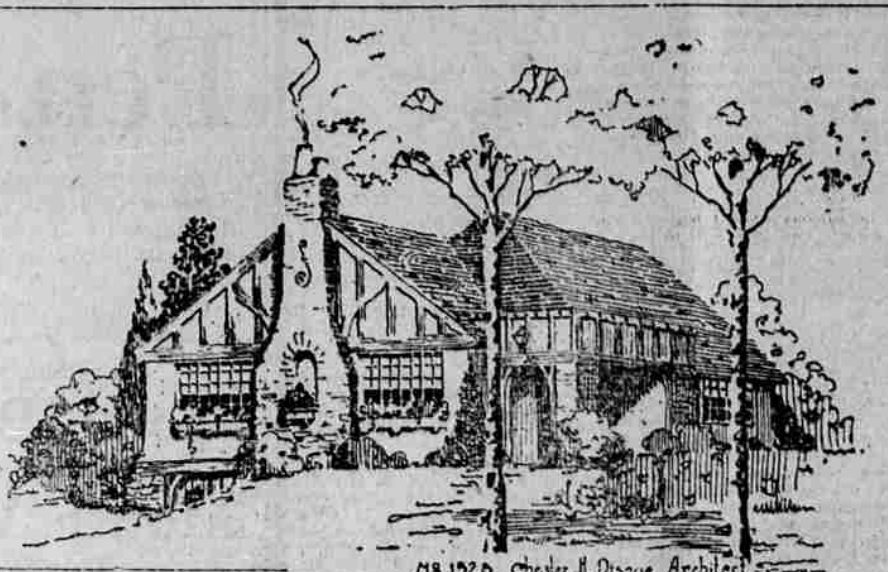
Mr. and Mrs. John Biebel, of Glover, were callers at Hilgard Wednesday evening on their way home from La Grande.

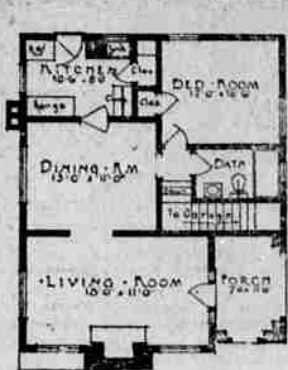
THE GARDEN

LANDSCAPE YOUR GROUNDS ON THE BUDGET PLAN

No longer does a home owner make actual use of only that part of his home grounds on which his house stands. The modern home embraces the entire lot, and assigns to every square foot of surface a function, useful or ornamental.

The owner who neglects to develop his grounds on this principle not only limits his own enjoyment of a property which has cost him plenty, but lessens its resale value, and why should he? Complete planting, according to a modern plan, may require more outlay than he cares to make in one year; but it is easily possible to spread the expenditure over several years on a budget system.

Of course if one can plant all at once, one gets the enjoyment of well-planted grounds the sooner. But it is much easier to plant part at a time, than to build in that way. Gardens do not depreciate with years as buildings do. With intelligent care they grow more valuable, and newer plantings quickly mature into perfect harmony with the old.

Lindbergh Back In Mexico City; Plans Unknown

MEXICO CITY, Mar. 11.—(AP)—There was some speculation today as to what Colonel Charles A. Lindbergh would do for the next few days.

Return to the United States was believed to be delayed at least until completion of repairs on his plane, City of Wichita, damaged when he crashed with his fiancée, Miss Anne Morrow, ten days ago.

While he might borrow a plane the aviator has shown no disposition to do so. He has now been in Mexico City a full fortnight, and while he has enjoyed every minute of his stay with Miss Morrow and the Morrow family he wishes to get back to work left behind him in the United States.

Persistent rumors that he and Miss Morrow will be married before he returns to the United States have been denied.

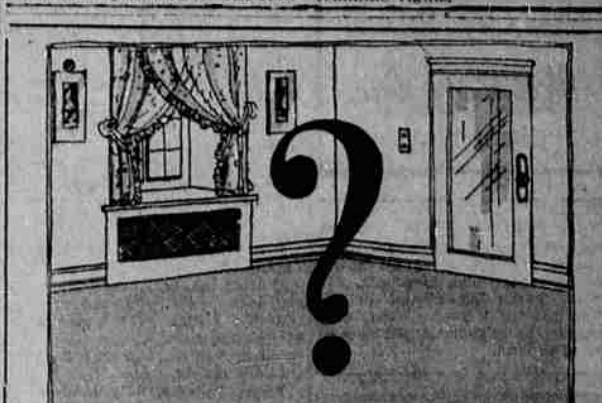
