GENEVA, March 13 (AP)—The international jurists, including Eilhu Root, are now in accord concerning all sections of the world court protocol dealing with the American reservation on advisory opinions. Mr. Root, however, is anxious to have the entire protocol carefully examined and made to conform to alterations in article four which concerns advisory opinions and it may be that the complete draft protocol will not be submitted before tomorrow.

Sabbath Defends Chicago; Finds It Fairly Peaceful

WASHINGTON, Mar. 13 (AP)—Agreeing that there is "a certain amount of crime" in Chicago, Representative Sabbath, democrat Illinois, contends there actually is less law violation per capita in that city and the state of Illinois than in the southern states "that have sent the leading and most obnoxious 'dry' advocates to congress." In an extension of remarks in the congressional record today, Sabbath, a wet, cited government figures showing that in 1928 there were ten times as many stilleries, three times as many stills, five times as many fermenters, and more than twice the number of gallons of mash seized in Alabama, Florida, and Georgia combined than in Illinois. The three states, he said, have a population 200,000 under that of his state.

Many Towns Have Radio Laws To Keep Peace In The Neighborhood WASHINGTON (AP)—To preserve the peace of the neighborhood and to protect both the listener and the non-listener, several states and cities have invoked the police power in the regulation of radio. A survey of these laws and ordinances taken by the legal department of the federal radio commission discloses a wide variety of legislation designed to curb interference, protect the public from the din of loud speakers, prevent fires, restrict the location of broadcasting stations and govern the installation of transmitting and receiving sets. Detroit has one of the most drastic ordinances. The operation of a noise making or noise amplifying instrument by which the peace of the neighborhood is disturbed is made a nuisance and the operation of any radio in any public or private place which disturbs or annoys persons owning or occupying property in the neighborhood is a misdemeanor. Oakland, Cal., has a similar ordinance and Memphis has drafted an ordinance to regulate the use of receiving in business establishments. The proposed law exempts musical instruments in the home. Spokane has a typical ordinance. It makes unlawful the operation of any instrument which causes electrical interference with radio reception between 5 p. m. and midnight. X-ray pictures or examinations are allowed in cases of emergency. A Minneapolis ordinance provides that no broadcasting station may be operated within the city without a municipal permit. An annual fee is exacted of broadcasters. The operation of a transmitter in the city or within two miles of the city limits is prohibited if the power is more than 500 watts. Minnesota has a law which requires the broadcasting of information helpful in locating stolen property and the apprehension of wrong-doers. A fire protection measure in St. Louis prescribes how installations of transmitters and receivers may be made. A Michigan act gives the public utilities commission authority to prohibit the operation of two or more stations within the state simultaneously if interference in reception results.
