"Object—Alimony" New Feature At The Arcade

The situations are new and presented with a rare understanding of human desires. Under the capable direction of Scott R. Dunlap, Columbia has produced a screen classic which is a graphic record of the money-mad, jazz-crazed age when love has a price and sincerity is rare.
