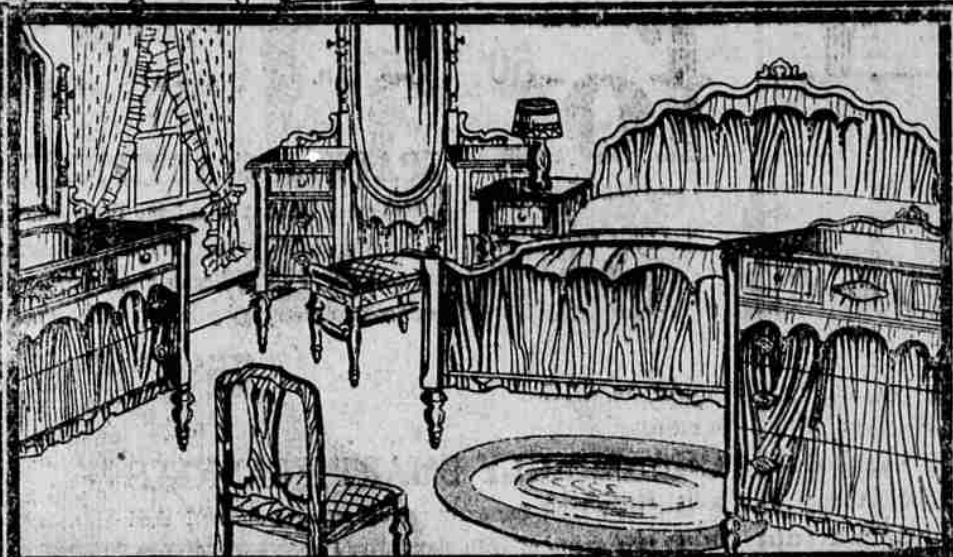

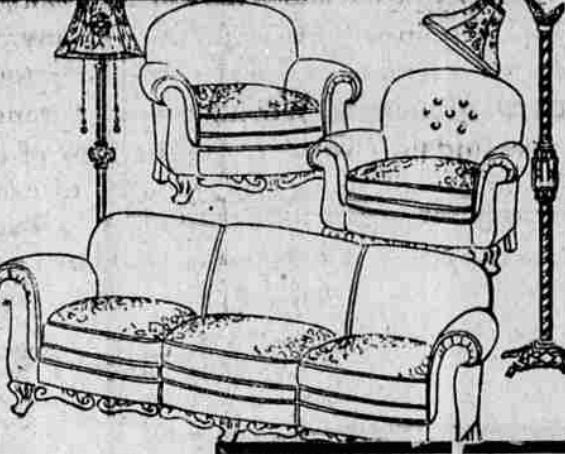

### MENUS

 Climate, age and occupation are the influencing factors which should control our daily diet. During the winter months the body has craved foods that would supply heat and the foods that do this are the starches, sugars and fats. A diet that is made up of these foods and meat without vegetables would prove inefficient and provide opportunity for disease. Although we may have used plenty of vegetables all winter we must keep on using them while we add fresh fruits for dessert in place of pudding.

It is vitally essential that we keep in our "ration" both fresh fruits and vegetables as well as milk. This means adults as well as children. While the amount of milk required for adults is less than that for children a pint a day should be calculated for grown-ups. This can be used in cooking.

Fruits and vegetables are bulky and not concentrated foods. To keep "fit" we must have some material that will give the digestive tract its much needed exercise. The French have called spinach "the groom of the stomach" and in the last few years we have learned that other vegetables can be substituted for spinach to good effect if the much-needed vegetable is personally abundant.

 Cream of pea soup, celery and onion, corn and apple fritters with crisp bacon, omelette salad with cream, cheese, fruit compote and cookies.
