Horsemanship Feats Featured In "Court-Martial"

Both Jack Holt and Betty Compson are experienced horseback riders and able to perform unusual feats in the saddle, but in making scenes for Columbia's special production, "Court-Martial," which is coming to the Star Theatre on Thursday, they participated in thrills which were new and startling to them.

Holt lives in the saddle. He is one of the few actors who have not succumbed to the lure of the automobile. Whenever Holt goes to work or out shopping he leaps to the back of Hornet, his favorite horse and rides away. Whenever a perplexing problem troubles the actor, or when he is out of sorts he mounts the horse and rides out in the open to think it over. It is not an uncommon sight to see Holt in make-up, leave a set between scenes and go galloping off on Hornet.

During the making of "Court-Martial" the actor lived in the saddle. All the players, the technical staff and director were mounted. Much of the action takes place in the open country and horseback riding was the only manner in which the Columbia company, under the supervision of George H. Seitz, could cover the ground.

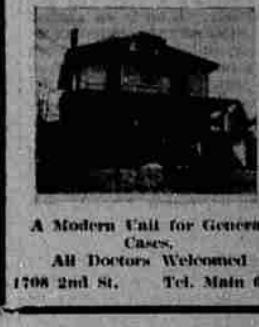
