Late March is still early enough in Oregon this year for the application of the dormant spray for the control of San Jose scale and pear leaf blight, just, says the experiment station. Liquid lime sulfur, 32 degrees Baume, gives best results when used 1 to 3 or 24 gallons in a 200-gallon spray tank. Oil emulsion, if used, should be diluted to four per cent oil or 5 to 6 gallons to 100. When dry lime sulfur is used, four pounds equal one gallon of the 32 degree liquid.

After thoroughly sweeping and cleaning the rugs or carpets, wiping them with a cloth wrung out of diluted ammonia will bring out the most faded floor covering.

## Recipe for fried ham

A famous cook gives these simple directions

It is sometimes so simple to improve the flavor of foods. For example, a certain household is noted for its delicious fried ham which is a specialty for Sunday morning breakfast and other "occasions." The cook was asked for the recipe, and here it is:

Take a slice of smoked ham one-half inch or more thick. Scar each side to a golden brown, then reduce the flame and sprinkle two teaspoons of granulated sugar on the exposed side, keeping the flame low so that the sugar does not burn. Then turn the ham and sprinkle two teaspoons of sugar on the other side, keeping the flame low until the sugar is thoroughly dissolved, and absorbed into the ham. When it is finished, you will have a delicious ham flavor such as you never found before.

The uses of sugar in bringing out and improving the flavors of foods are practically unlimited. Sweeten cereals and note how much more children enjoy them. Add sugar to grapefruit or any other health-giving fruit that may be harsh to the taste. Sugar does not injure the beneficial acids and vitamins in any way.
