## MENUS

Fruit juices stiffened by the addition of gelatin make an excellent dessert for almost all ages and types. The person who is dieting to reduce may have this dessert without crasin, the one who wants to gain in weight will find the fruit stimulating to the appetite while the cream will add to her calories.

Rice pudding is nourishing, inexpensive and can be made most attractive. A creamy rice pudding properly made is relished by the whole family, from the youngest to the oldest and should be served as attractively as the most elaborate dessert.

Well cooked cornstarch puddings have three points in their favor and if made with fruit gain an extra point.

All kinds of custards are nourishing but are sometimes expensive when eggs are high. However, when they take the place of meat the housewife is justified in serving them. There are many ways of varying plain custards that add to their interest. Stoned and chopped dates, preserved ginger finely minced, caramelized sugar and different combinations of flavoring are suggestions for pleasing variations.

Chilled Orange Souffle

Three eggs, 1/2 lemon, 1 table-spoon granulated gelatin, 2 oranges, 1/2 cup sugar, few grains salt, 1/2 cup cold water, 1/2 cup whipping cream.

Soften gelatin in cold water for five minutes. Beat yolks of eggs with sugar and lemon juice. Cook over hot water until thickened. Add soaked gelatin and let stand until cool. Add pulp of oranges freed from skin and seeds, whites of eggs beaten until stiff and dry and cream whipped until firm. Turn into a mold and let stand on ice for two hours or longer, until thoroughly chilled and firm. Unmold and serve.

PARIS (AP)—Shoes of bright colors which match scarf and handbag are upon the market for summer sale. Many are meant for evening wear.

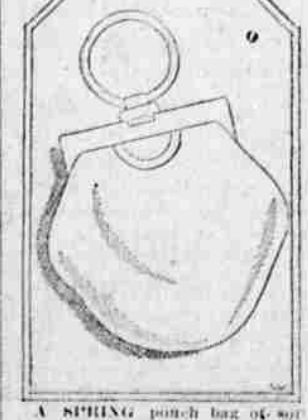
Not only for sport, but for afternoon and evening costumes the footwear which combines two colors in designs that are carried out in other accessories, is making a bid for popularity.

One big dressmaking house is pushing the two colored shoe with handbag to match, for all it is worth, even to the point of contrasting shoes and handbag with the shade of the gown itself. Much black and white for evening gives wide scope to the shoe designers in the matter of color and they are making the most of their chance to accustom women to wearing shoes more brilliant than their costume.

Probably the favorite two-color shoe is midnight blue and flag red combined with gold. Worn with a white costume, with diamond ornaments of star design, and handbag or vanity case which carries out the coloring of the shoes, the red, white and blue ensemble is dazzling in effect.

Jade green and melon pink frequently are used together, and two shades of yellow, with black also are much seen.

The shoes of many colors usually are made with toe of one shade, heel of another and applied trimming bands of a third color.
