Herrick's Body Starts On Long Trip To America

BREST, France, Apr. 5 (AP)—The body of Myron T. Herrick, American ambassador to France, made good-bye to French soil today and aboard the Tourville, finest of French cruisers, started the long trip back to America. The farewell, however, was to France and not to Frenchmen—until its arrival Apr. 13, at New York the body will remain in the hands of men of the country he loved and which loved him.

Commandant J. M. C. Abrial, captain of the Tourville, accepted his charge with moving military terseness:

"In the name of my country I salute the body of a friend of France. He is now in my charge and will reach America safely." The reception of the body

aboard the cruiser was brief but impressive. A salvo of 19 guns—the ambassadorial salute—shook Brest roads as a small shrieking crane carried it to the Tourville's deck from that of the sunboat Dolmen which had brought it from the wharves.

HIGHWAY ROBBERY
GRANTS PASS, Ore., Apr. 5 (AP)—The first highway robbery near this city since the days of the Oregon Jones gang, was reported last night six miles south of Grants Pass on the Pacific highway. A. G. Hull of Medford, was held up at the point of a gun by a masked highwayman who received only \$4.35 for his trouble.

Which provides a rather unfortunate example of the course of justice in American courts sometimes. Both cannot be guilty.

ECONOMY IN HIGHWAY BONDS

No action has yet been taken by the state highway commission on the proposal made during the recent legislative session that small blocs of new bonds be issued for a few years to permit more rapid completion of the present highway system. Oregon roads pay for themselves. They promote travel and therefore increase receipts for their construction and maintenance. They constitute the primary reason why the state enjoys a tourist business worth many millions each year. Any means by which needed improvement and new construction can be accomplished without an added tax burden should receive the careful attention of the commission. To issue not to exceed a million dollars worth of bonds this year, for example, would provide funds for work that is seriously needed. It would not, however, be an additional tax burden since motorists are paying the license fee and gas tax through which both bonds and interest are being paid. Principal and interest payments schedules are at their peak, however, at the present time and some pressing highway work is likely to suffer in consequence. With a bond issue of only a million each year for the next three or four years, that handicap would be overcome. It would allow the straightening and widening of the La Grande-Kamela section of the Old Oregon Trail—one of the outstanding needs at the present time—and would permit improvement work of like character in other sections of the state. Even a million in bond money for one or two years would provide important relief. Traffic is on the increase. Modern motor cars demand wider, better main arteries. Road betterment is an investment in state progress that should not be delayed. Revenue from additional bonds now would be a state economy in the long run.
