



NEW BUILDING IN WEEK AT \$1,870

6 Permits Issued; Brings Construction Total Up to \$46,550

In spite of generally disagreeable weather last week, six building permits were issued at the city recorder's office, providing for new

construction and repair work amounting to \$1,870. The permits ranged in size from \$100 to \$670. The \$1,870 figure for the first week of April brought the total for 1929 up to \$46,550.

The largest permit was issued to H. P. Nielsen, who is to alter and repair the Foley hotel building at the corner of Chestnut and Adams. The remodeling of that part of the Julius Roesech building on Adams to be occupied by the Larsson Chevrolet company, is to cost \$500. W. Vedder is the contractor.

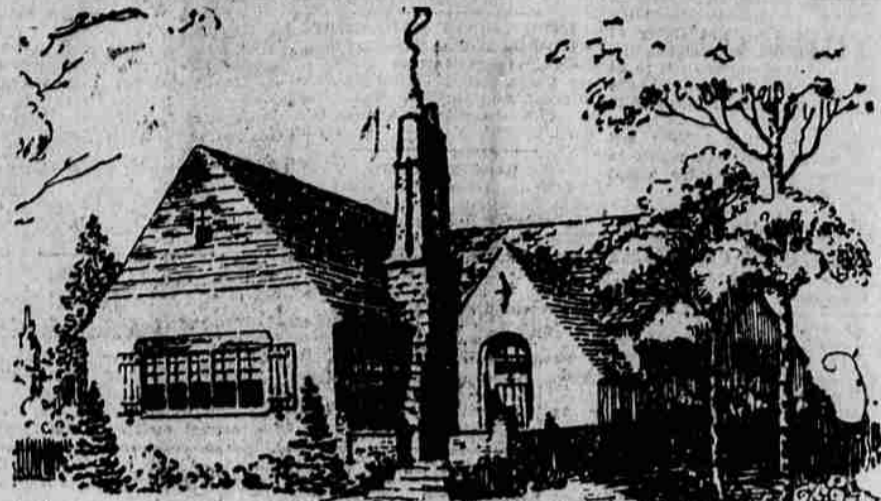

Apr. 2—H. P. Nielsen, to alter and repair three-story brick business building on Adams between Chestnut and Depot, for the Commercial Hotel company, work to cost \$670.

Apr. 4—Bon Noyes, to alter and repair a dwelling on Washington between Fir and Greenwood, work to cost \$300.

Apr. 4—C. N. Cameron, to alter and repair a dwelling on Cedar between Jefferson and Adams, work to cost \$150.

Endorse Grade Marking Plans

Unqualified approval of the system of grade-marking of lumber to indicate its quality, as advocated by the national committee on wood utilization of the department of commerce, has been registered by American builders, through a resolution passed at a recent convention of the National Association of Builders Exchanges.

"This association endorses the valuable work being done by the national committee on wood utilization in general," the builders' exchange resolution declares, "but particularly its work on grade marking of lumber," and expresses the further belief that grade marking "will help materially in the elimination of irresponsible and unscrupulous contractors and material men."

THREE FISHERMEN LOST

FREEMONT, Ohio, April 8 (AP)—The small boat which was occupied yesterday by three Freemont men fishing in Sandusky Bay, was found early today overturned and empty, floating near the mouth of the bay. The capsized craft was discovered by coast guardsmen from Marblehead, who had searched the bay most of last night. The coast guardsmen said that the three fishermen must have lost their lives.

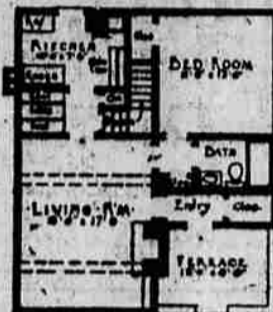

Although measuring only twenty-five feet six inches by thirty feet, this modern little stucco bungalow contains many distinctive features not ordinarily found in a house of this size.

The stucco walls rest on a concrete block foundation, stone being used at the base of the chimney and relieved by brick work at the top. The brick work is repeated in the walls around the terrace. Dark stained clambars are made to harmonize with the heavy oak lintels, batten shutters, main entrance door and in about sixty per cent of the wood shingles of the roof, where there are also other shades of browns and reds.

All the windows are metal casements with concealed rolling fly screens. No woodwork is used to finish these openings, the plaster itself being carried into the window recesses. The principal rooms of the house are floored with narrow oak flooring, yellow pine flooring being used in the kitchen and tile in the bathroom.

The lavatory in the bathroom is

a pedestal type with built-in steel medicine cabinet above, electric outlets on each side. The bath tub, of course, is built-in. The casings of the single panel doors and baseboards throughout

the house can be of either gum or chestnut, stained to suit the owner, and waxed. The plastering, except in the kitchen, is of a medium rough texture modern finish.

If the grade permits, a garage may be contained in the basement which has cement floor, laundry tub, warm air furnace, and domestic hot-water heater.

The estimated cost of this house is from \$3,800 to \$4,500, exclusive of heating and plumbing.

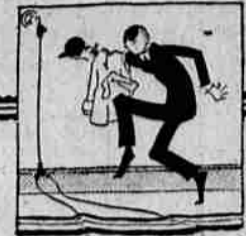
To Make Uniform Vacancy Surveys

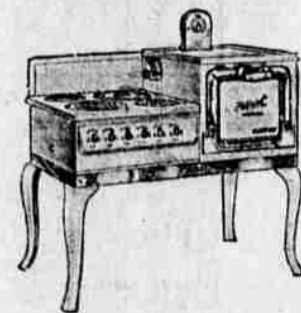
