CHICAGO, April 10 (AP)—Opening 1 1/2 to 1 3/4 down, Chicago wheat later showed something of a rally. Corn, oats, and provisions were also easier, with corn starting 1/4 to 1/2 off, but afterward partly recovering. Wheat closed nervous 1/2 to 1 1/4 net lower, corn 1/4 to 1/2 down, oats 1/2 to 3/4 off and provisions at a setback of 10 to 25c.

Frequent Shifts In Stock Trading

NEW YORK, April 10 (AP)—Frequent shifts of speculative sentiment in today's market testified to the nervousness prevailing in professional trading. Weakness developed in the radio shares and a few specialties but they rallied again when heavy buying was resumed in the oil group.
 Call money renewed at 8 per cent but advanced to 9 as banks continued to call loans in preparation for mid-month settlements.
 Many of the popular shares, particularly the merchandise and office equipment groups advanced in the last hour. Montgomery Ward and Underwood - Elliott - Fisher moved up more than 6 points each. Here and there in the list, however, shares were under pressure after the call money rate was raised to 10 per cent. Adams Express slumped 20 points to 620. The closing tone was irregular.
 Total sales approximated 2,500,000 shares.

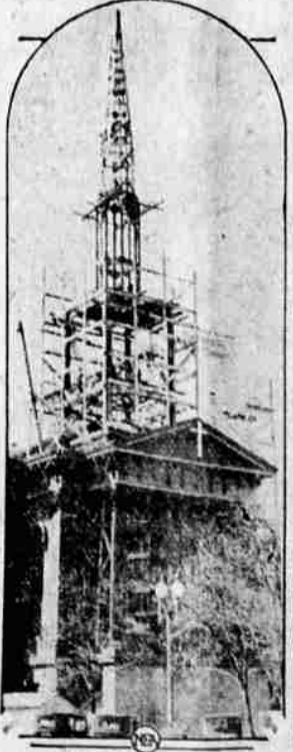
Pit silos are becoming quite common in many sections of the country, finds the experiment station. The popularity of this type of silo has come about due to the unsatisfactory service from wooden silos under the prevailing climatic conditions and the high cost of constructing masonry silos in some of the more or less isolated sections. Pit silos can be constructed by unskilled labor at a comparatively small outlay of cash. When properly constructed they are permanent and safe with practically no cost for repairs.

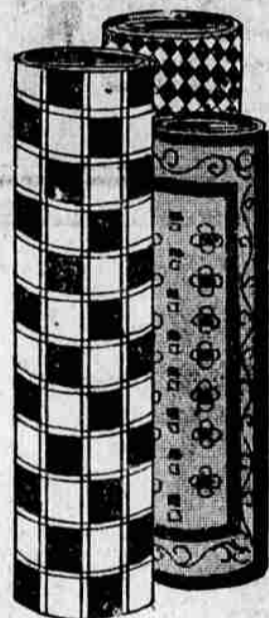

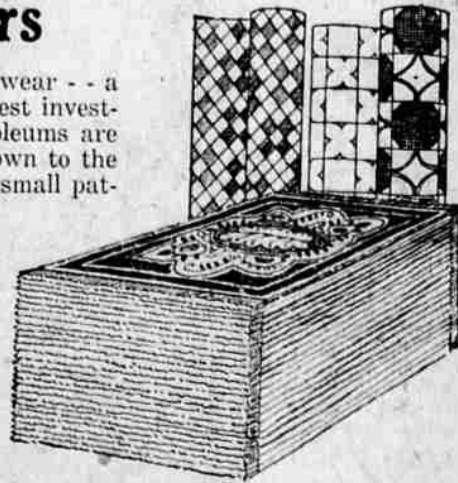
