

Three Hurt, One Killed And One Missing In Blast

DETROIT, Apr. 12—(AP)—While members of 16 fire fighting units searched through tons of debris, police today sought to determine the cause of an explosion which late yesterday demolished a four-story building on East Jefferson Ave., between Randolph and Bates streets, damaged two adjacent structures and caused the death of at least one man.

Three persons were injured and one is missing. The blast occurred at 6:23 p. m., in a building used on the ground floor as a paint and varnish warehouse. Within a few seconds fire broke out in the two adjoining buildings.

The dead man, who had been identified early today, was blown into the street as he passed the building. The three injured persons were knocked down, suffering minor hurts. Herbert Tallon, head of a furniture company, who was believed to have been in the building at the time of the explosion, had not been found early today.

THE CARE OF THE TEETH

The last few years have brought knowledge of the importance of the care of the teeth and of the influence of the teeth upon the general health of the body. Prevention of tooth defects should be started early in the life of the individual and early in the life of the tooth. No defects are too slight to receive attention and the first set of teeth should receive as much care as the second set in order to assure the proper development of the jaws and head.

In the care of the teeth six things are essential:

(1) Diet. The diet should begin in the prenatal life of the child, in the mother's food. Plenty of the right kind of food builds strong teeth.

(2) Milk. At least one pint every day.

(3) Green vegetables as spinach, carrots, tomatoes, lettuce, cabbage and peas.

(4) Raw fruits as oranges, apples, pears and grapefruit.

(5) Coarse whole wheat breads and other rough foods.

(6) Exercise. In order to develop strong teeth coarse foods should be chewed thoroughly.

(7) Sunshine. Daily sun-baths to enable the body to assimilate the calcium derived from the foods.

(8) Cleanliness. Daily care is necessary to prevent the accumulation of food particles and germs around the teeth.

(9) Have a clean brush that is small enough to reach all corners of the mouth.

(10) Brush the upper teeth with a downward motion and the lower teeth with an upward movement. Never brush toward the gums.

(11) Brush the gums as well as the teeth.

(12) Brush the cutting edges forward and backward.

(13) Brush the tongue, then rinse the mouth thoroughly.

(14) Rinse the brush well and hang it in a light airy place to dry. It is well to have two brushes and to use them alternately.

(15) Rest. Plenty of rest for the mother and growing child is essential. Ten to 12 hours sleep is necessary for healthy development.

(16) Dental inspection. Regular visits every six months are necessary to secure the proper care of the teeth.

Dental service should be started early and be systematic and regular if the teeth are to be kept in the best possible condition. Early dental prophylaxis will assure good teeth at a minimum of expense.

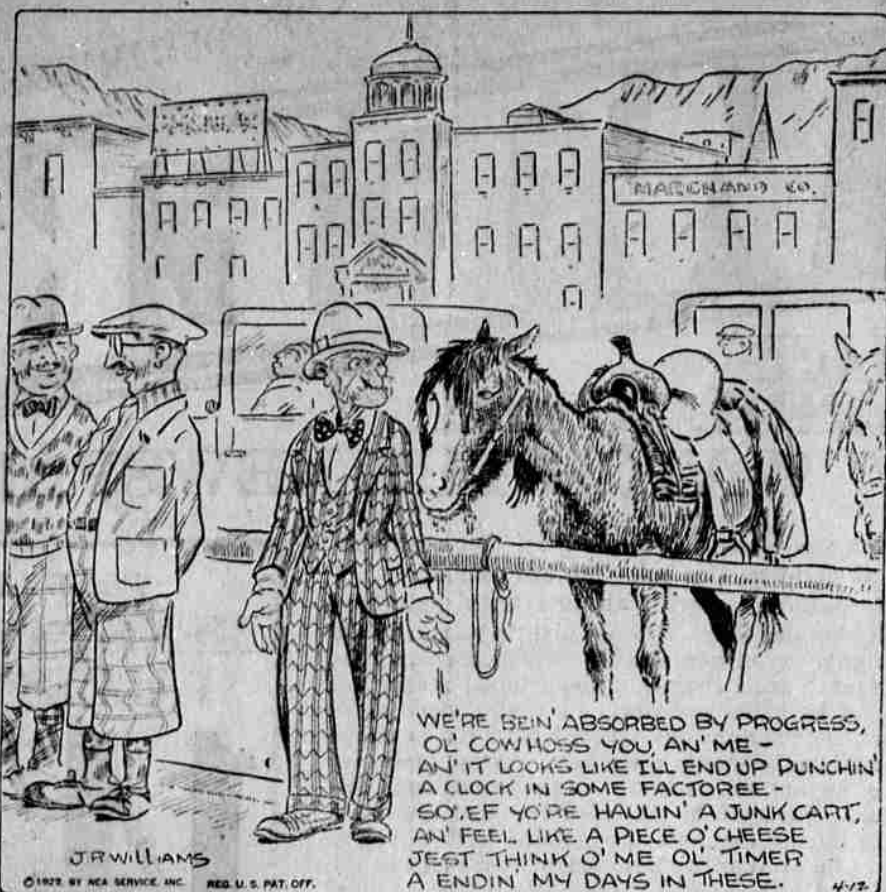

BEND, Ore., Apr. 12—(AP)—With her throat torn by the fangs of a supposedly rabid coyote, Miss Mabel Gordon, 17-year-old Silverlake girl, was today awaiting arrival of serum being rushed here from the state board of health laboratory in Portland. The wound is regarded as serious. Wednesday night, hearing a commotion in the poultry yard, Miss Gordon went to see what was causing the disturbance. She scarcely reached the yard when a coyote sprang at her, sinking five fangs into her throat. Aroused by her cries, the family went to her aid and the animal was shot. Porcupine quills were found in its body, which was taken as definite proof the animal was rabid, as coyotes rarely attack porcupines.

Dr. P. D. Stricker, of the state board of health in Portland, expressed the opinion in a telephone message the coyote was rabid and asked that the skull be sent to the state laboratories.
