Al Jolson At Arcade Tomorrow In Vitaphone Show

To work this bill poster, Tryon merely sits in his truck and pushes a button. The paste is applied to the sheets and a brush and roller put them in place.

In preceding photoplays Tryon has employed various ribald-antics such as the Goolber-gun for eating peanuts, a novelty hotel register and pen, an automatic bell hop which takes baggage to your door, an automatic windshield cleaner and dryer, an energy saving taxi-cab and countless amazing gadgets.

The amazing thing about these inventions is that they are practical in use but impractical to make and market because of the prohibitive cost. Tryon and Director William Craft are personally responsible for most of the inventions.

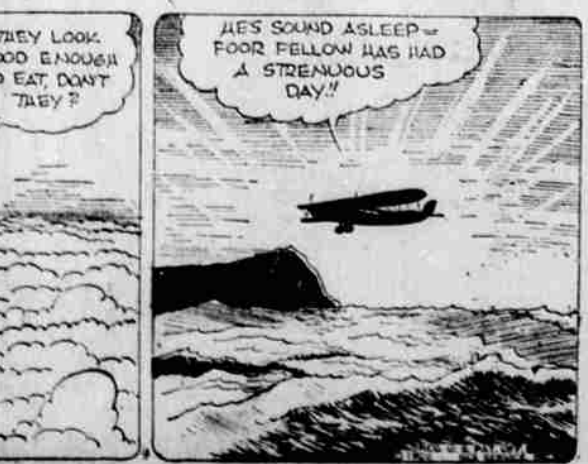
