REDS AND BEAVER CLUB CONTESTING

Mission Outfit Expected to Win Series—Angels Out in Front

Pitching arms were well lubricated, and long distance baseball bats were highly polished today, as club leaguers took position for a new onslaught along the 1929 pennant front. With the lines more finely drawn after three weeks of series play, the competition in all sectors was expected to be much keener.

This afternoon the San Francisco Seals clash with their old rivals from across the bay—the sturdy Oaks, while the Missions were scheduled to meet the Beavers at Portland. Sacramento was matched with Los Angeles, and the Hollywood Stars were ready to meet the Indians at Seattle.

From indications thus far in the season, the Angels, top flecks in the league standing, were set for a good week, with expectations of building up a stronger lead against the Senators, who last week dropped all seven games to the Seals like a basket of eggs. The Angels had a percentage of .700, with 14 games to their credit, and six lost.

The San Francisco Mission Reds were next in the league standing, with 11 games won, and 9 lost, and in their ranks this week with the Beavers were expected to make a good showing and give the Angels a run for first place in the pennant race. If they do as well against Seattle, this should be accomplished.

Bagshaw To Stay One More Year Before Quitting

SEATTLE, April 16 (AP)—Definite announcement next Wednesday night on the compromise proposal made by Enoch Bagshaw, head football coach at the University for another season and then resign, with the provision that full payments be made for the two years remaining in their contracts was promised here last night, following an executive session of the student board of control.

The board, which originally demanded that Bagshaw resign at once and accept full payment on the three years now remaining on his contract, at first refused to accept Bagshaw's proposal, which was made through his attorney, Ward Kumm. The board, however, reconsidered this action after a conference in executive session with Bagshaw's assistants, Dorset V. Graves, Wayne Sutton and Bart Spellman.

Wildcat Defeats Armand Emanuel In Los Angeles

LOS ANGELES, Apr. 16 (AP)—A good little man—if he is a wildcat, can beat a good big man.
Ace Hudkins, the tounded middleweight "Wildcat" from Nebraska, proved last night that the age-old adage devolving around big and little men does not always hold true.
Before a crowd of over 15,000 at Wrigley field here, the two-haired middleweighter, ripped, tore and slashed with a fury that never abated at Armand Emanuel, clever Pan Francisco light heavyweight, to a decisive triumph. The raising of his hand in token of victory was but a formality.
Pictures at weighing-in time said that the Wildcat was a scant half score pounds lighter. At ringside he must have spotted Emanuel at least 15 pounds. He fought as his followers here never have seen him fight. Before the weight disadvantage he made up with a smashing style that could not be denied. He swept through the 10-round battle at such a relentless pace that the outcome was seen long before the final gong.
The Nebraska's crushing, never idle fists carried away at least seven of the rounds. Emanuel garnered but one, ringsiders almost unanimously agreed, and the other two sessions were even. Emanuel's lone round was the tenth when he regained his fighting pose and out-boxed the "Wildcat." That was for one round only, however, and many of his followers had thought he would outbox Hudkins throughout.

CHICAGO, Apr. 16 (AP)—Two dreamers, one whose dream came true and another who is certain his will be realized, were important actors in the Cubs' part in the National league opening today.
They are William Wrigley Jr., owner of the team, and Rogers Hornsby, the Missouri farmer whose big bat is expected to add the pennant winning spark to the Cub attack.
"Well, I have struggled along quite a long time and I have spent several million dollars trying to get a team like this," Wrigley beamed as he surveyed his 1929 edition. "But I believe it will realize a dream for me—a National league baseball pennant for Chicago."
"Look at those boys. Not only do they have talent, but they have a will to win and they are hustlers. If they don't win the pennant—well, we'll try harder next year. But I have a good hunch they will deliver this time."
Hornsby's wish was realized several months ago when he was sold to the Cubs for approximately a half million dollars in cash and players.
"I have wanted to play in Chicago for years," the rajah said, "and today I am here, and ready to do my best to help in the pennant drive. See that short right field fence? Man, how I have yearned to get more cracks at that!"

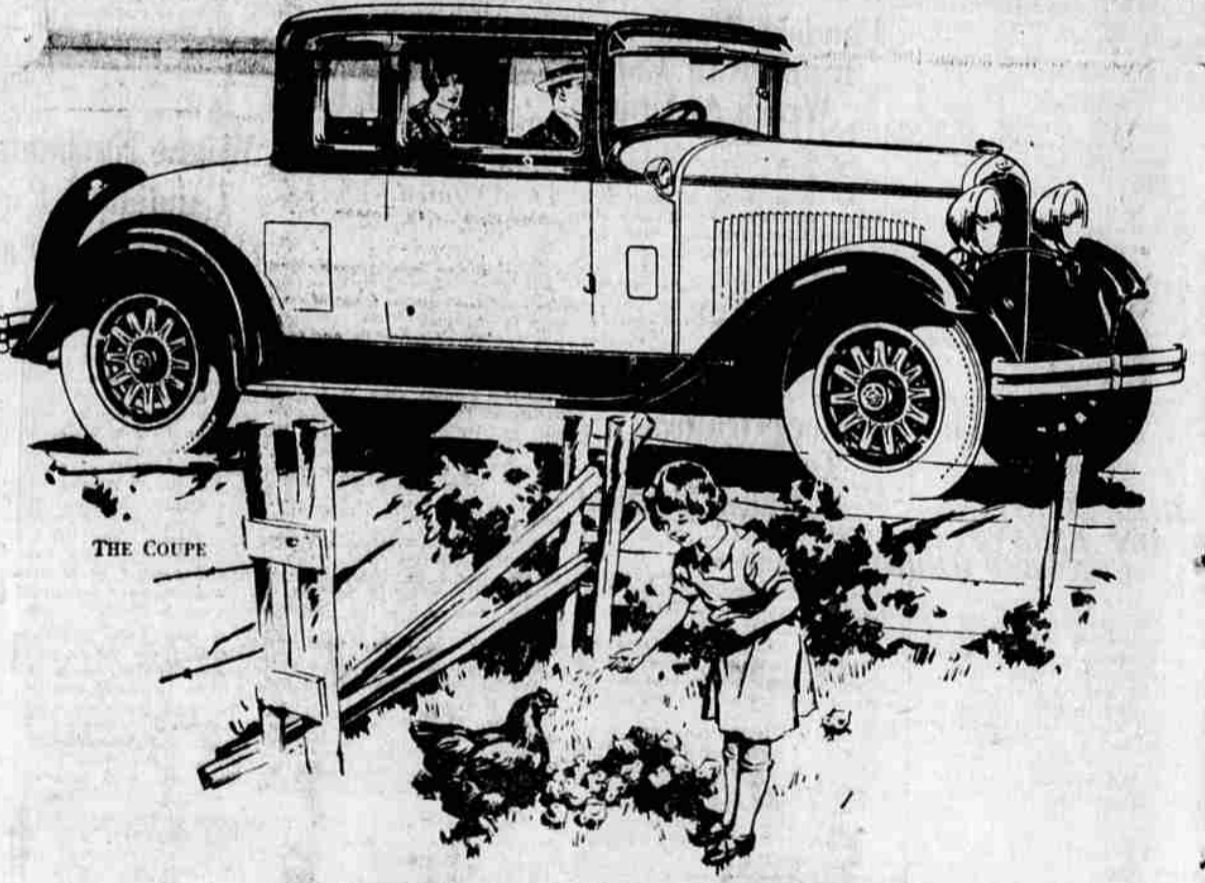
