Babe Ruth Gets Homer in First Time At Plate

Whatever the fate of the Yankees in their fourth quest for the rainbow's end and the pot of pennant gold, American league pitchers are due to spend many anxious afternoons trying to circumvent a Babe Ruth bent upon battering down the fences in leftfield instead of right. Employing an entirely new stance at the plate, with his left foot swung back almost out of the batter's box, the big Bambino opened his 1929 campaign with a home run in his first attempt yesterday, and so started the Yankees toward a 3 to 2 triumph over the Red Sox in the first game at the Yankee stadium.

The cold weather kept the opening crowd down to 35,000 hardy clients, but a good half of these washed the homerun king in a friendly but vigorous fashion at the close.

The Athletics made it two straight over the senators at Washington, winning by 8 to 2. Rube Walcott pitched for his first career, over the Senators after the Mackmen got him six runs in the fifth.

The Browns won their third straight from the White Sox by 4 to 1, and the Cleveland Indians made it two out of three from Detroit with an 8 to 4 victory.

The eastern opening of the National league was just as frost-bitten as that of the American, and more dismal. The Giants gave an unimpressive display in defeating the Phillies by 11 to 5, and the less said about Boston's 13 to 12 victory over Brooklyn, the more charitable it will be for all concerned—excluding the 2,500 venturous Bostonians who paid to see it.

As the Giants, with Larry Benton in the box, sagged before a Paddy rally in the ninth, distant rumbles drifted from the Chicago front where Bruin howlers again were blasting a path through Pirate defenses. The Cubs won by 11 to 1 behind Shertoff Fred Baker, and made it two out of three from the Buccaneers.

James Haines outpitched Adolfo Luque at Cincinnati to give the champion Cardinals two out of three against the Reds so far in the opening series. The score was 3 to 1.

NEW YORK, Apr. 19—(AP)—The new football fumble rule has stirred up another controversy with Sydney E. Hutchinson, chairman of the council on athletics and the football committee at the University of Pennsylvania, and Edward K. Hall, of the national football rules committee, as the principal debaters.

Declaring that the new rule making it illegal for a player on the defending side to run with a fumble ball has met with "almost unanimous" disfavor, Hutchinson asks that application of the new regulation be postponed until 1930.
