most intense orange yet developed in calendars. It will have to live up to its foreign reputation to compete with Ball type but will be an interesting addition to the garden. The calendula will stand almost any quarters and give good bloom, even some shade, but it needs good soil and plenty of sun to do its full duty. It is an annual of long blooming season and given an early start it will flourish from July until cut down by killing frosts, giving a succession of bloom. The bloom is encouraged by keeping seed pods picked. It is one of the fine annuals for cutting and not many seed pods are given a chance to ripen in the average garden owing to the demand for the bloom for house decoration. These annuals seem to stand closer planting than their size would justify under ordinary circumstances, six inches apart seem- ing to accommodate them nicely, the branches interlocking and giving a solid mass of the soft green foliage surmounted with scores of the fine orange and yellow blooms.
